CREATING A LOVE OF JUDAISM

Mah Rabu moments

For many years, camp staff, volunteers, committee and board members have been working to deepen our Judaic and Israeli education. We've prepared the soil and planted seeds, and sometimes we get to stand back and appreciate how the campers and summer staff tend to and harvest those fruits. Many of my Mah Rabu moments this summer were in witnessing the full expression of those years of work and attention!

Herzl's Mah Rabu tradition began with a group of Conerstone Fellows, 4-6 returning staff who attend a national conference focused on creating intentional and meaningful Jewish programming at camp. A few years ago, the Fellows developed the idea of adding a "Mah Rabu" prayer and weekly focus during Shabbat services to acknowledge the wonderful and amazing moments of the camp week.

I was radically amazed as our traditional B'yachad/Kadimah Ultimate game grew to include the Ruach Award: Given by the team captains to a member of the opposing team or group to recognize sportsmanship, integrity and true ruach, defined as the ability to positively affect a group with your attitude and actions.

I hummed the Mah Rabu prayer as our focus on integrating Middot (soul traits like discipline or kindness) into all chugim and activities blossomed into the Mensch Award. Campers and staff are nominated by their peers for truly exemplifying the week's middah in daily



camp life and two are honored with a Maftir aliyah.

In a summer filled with magical, amazing moments, one moonlit night stands out. It

showed me how deeply our Jewish programming takes root in our campers as they develop into young adults.

On that July night, I was on a "walk and talk" with a staff member when we passed the Mercaz, our outdoor prayer space overlooking the lake. The sight of the moon took our breath away! An almost full moon, against a clear sky, reflecting on a peaceful Devils Lake. As we took a moment to appreciate it, we knew it was too good not to share.

So I radio'd the B'yachad RK's (roshei k'vutza or group leaders). I had a feeling our oldest campers would appreciate it.

And so they came. Out of the quiet of camp. To the Mercaz. As one large group. The Yachers gathered together under the beauty of the natural world.

I knew that camp was doing something right when the campers broke out into "Mah Rabu." The k'vutza (group) then sang the "Moon Song," a nightly song mainly sung by female-identified cabins until recently, and then the shema.

It's moments like this where I believe, in my heart of hearts, in the power of camp. A full moon sighting that brings about community, organic participation in Jewish ritual and tradition, acknowledgement of awe and wonder, and appreciation of the surroundings.

Wow. Just wow.

We will be forever grateful to Marlys and Elliott Badzin for the gift of our 5-star waterfront and Tayelet. Those who were lucky enough to experience it left very impressed with its beauty and excited about what it brings to camp for generations to come. And we are thrilled to be adding even more waterfront toys and programmatic adventures this coming summer.

With this expansion, we went from 13 lifeguards in 2018 to over 40 in 2019, which leads me to my point: Smack in the middle of Herzl's mission statement it states, “young people become self-reliant, creating lasting Jewish friendships and develop commitment and love for Judaism and Israel.” Nowhere does it state it only applies to Jews.

Last year we employed 10 international staff at camp, mainly to provide experienced, skilled, and trained waterfront staff. They also served successfully in many other areas of camp. They came to us from Australia, United Kingdom, South Africa, and even Eau Claire. They are not Jewish, and many of them had never even met a Jew.

They came to Herzl with open minds, hearts, and arms—with no idea about what to expect, only knowing they had a job to do. And they all performed magnificently. (See page 6 for more details.)

In their exit interviews, I was touched to hear how, like thousands of young people before them, Herzl has now become their home, too. Many of them

want to come back! They made lasting Jewish friendships and developed a love for Judaism and Israel. (Albeit, they are a little confused that the Shabbat whites

is just a camp thing, so be kind if they show up in white at your temple.)

THE AUDRA AND LOREN MINTZ FAMILY FUND



Herzl staff create camp's ruach

As we take stock of our 74th summer and look ahead to our 75th year, we are stopping for a Mah Rabu moment to acknowledge our staff. The Herzl magic is the product of each member of the Herzl family making a choice—a choice to send your child to camp, a choice to recommend camp to a friend, a choice to provide a scholarship for a family in need... Our staff make a choice each hour of each day of every summer to bring the ruach, make the magic, go one step further to make a camper feel special, make a discussion memorable, a flag song funny, or a Havdallah unique.

Herzl is blessed with many long-term staff. Among our year-round staff, the average tenure is close to a decade—the newbies are those who can't remember the Old Chadar or the time before backs on the Mercaz benches. We are fortunate to have their institutional memory and dedication.

This longevity isn't unique to our full-time staff; our summer staff also can number their camp Shabbats in the dozens. Nearly all of Herzl's staff grew up at our camp. It is not uncommon for our staff to be the children and grandchildren of Herzl alumni. Carrying on camp traditions is one of the things that makes Herzl unique. The dedication that our staff show to the next generation of campers is radically amazing.

We asked some of this summer's staff to share a moment that they treasure from the summer. Not surprisingly, they focused on legacy and history: "Best moment of this summer was seeing how my campers grew closer as friends," Sam Schachtman said. "I love working with my friends to give campers as good of a summer as we had when we were campers."

"This summer I had the amazing opportunity to cheer along with my Kadimah campers as we defeated the Kadimah Wall," Eliana Smelansky said. "It was so surreal seeing my campers bond together,

er, just as I bonded with my Kadimah five years ago."

It continues on as alumni, too. Every summer, we welcome back the Ozrim from 10 years before. These twenty-six year-olds return to spend a Shabbat at camp, teaching and learning from this year's Ozrim and staff, returning to their roots and contributing to the on-going Herzl legacy.

Year after year, the torch moves slowly from one generation to the next, we are blessed with history, rich in ruach, and tied to tradition...

these staff a homebase for days off. Our summer staff opened their homes, provided rides, and helped navigate institutions like the social security office and Uber.

Here's some of our international staff's thoughts on the experience: "I tried to prep myself by watching old Herzl YouTube videos and scrolling through camp's website, so I felt like I had a feeling Herzl. However, I worried that not knowing the customs or prayers would be a problem, but so many people helped me learn everything that I needed to know," Ryan Van Blaricom said. "I found

out that I am more open minded than I thought I was. After my first weekend, Shabbat became one of the highlights of my summer."

"I was excited and interested to learn about Jewish culture but I was also a little nervous because I had never met a Jewish person before, but after my first day, all the nerves went away," Emma Backen said. "I got to learn so much! I made lifelong friends and had so many memorable moments.

It was an experience of a lifetime and something I will remember and be grateful for forever."

We take this moment to say Mah Rabu for every staff person's choice to bring the ruach every hour of every day, to welcome the stranger, to celebrate tradition and strive to give campers the best summer of their lives, summer after summer.

So what happens when a radically amazing expansion of camp's waterfront forces camp to throw open the doors and welcome in skilled staff who have never been to Herzl or to the United States, and for some, never met a Jewish person before?! It was a wonderful infusion of much-needed skills and fresh eyes and ideas for our beloved traditions.

This summer, we brought 33 staff from around the world to camp. They came ready to teach swimming, sailing, windsurfing, and waterskiing. Twenty families opened their homes to give



Being in the middle of nowhere really helps campers to forget about realities like school and all the other problems that cause stress. At Herzl, campers are isolated from the real world both physically and technologically, creating a carefree and relaxed environment.

Herzl helps me to feel more Jewish - to embrace my Judaism and enjoy it. At camp, everything is kosher, we pray before and after we eat, and we have a designated time every morning for Jewish education. This may not sound fun, but it really is!

At camp, every prayer is a song that comes with hand motions and dances, and the praying in the mornings usually involves games and activities.

While all parts of camp are fun, the most special part is Shabbat. Shabbat makes me feel the most connected to Judaism; it is a magical experience. Every Friday evening we get extra time to shower and dress nicely; everyone at camp wears white. We have a caravan where everyone holds pinkies and goes around camp singing songs in Hebrew.

Then we have a service at the Mercaz, overlooking the lake, where all of camp comes together and prays. The Mercaz is one of my favorite places in camp, it makes me feel so Jewish and connected to God and everything around me.






SUMMER 2019 IN PHOTOS

HALL OF FAME 2019




Richard Bachrach


