

Mac Bybee, President/CEO at ABC Nevada

Mac Bybee has spent nearly his entire career working in Nevada politics. After graduating from the University of Nevada with a degree in Political Science and minor in Economics in 1999, he moved to Washington, DC to work for U.S. Senator Richard Bryan in his last year in office. After Bryan's retirement, Bybee was hired by U.S. Senator John Ensign to serve as a Legislative Correspondent. In 2006, Bybee returned to Nevada to help run Dean Heller's race for Congress. Heller was Secretary of State at the time. After a successful campaign, Bybee returned to Capitol Hill to serve as Press Secretary for Congressman Heller---running his reelection campaign in 2008. When Heller was appointed to the United States Senate in 2011, Bybee served as the lead for the transition from the U.S. House of Representatives to the United States Senate. Serving as Deputy Chief of Staff to Senator Heller, Bybee held a senior role in the Senate office and on the campaign in 2012. In both roles, Bybee was responsible for developing and executing communication strategies for the Senator. Upon the Heller's successful election to the United States Senate, Bybee once again retuned to Nevada to work as a senior aide to Governor Bryan Sandoval. Mac ran press operations and community outreach programs for the Governor. The past seven years, Mac Bybee has served as the President and CEO of the Associated Builders and Contractors, Nevada Chapter. In this capacity, he is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the association. One of his primary responsibilities is conducting government affairs work on behalf of ABC.
