Endowment Ministries Workshop

A healthy endowment extends the mission and ministry of a congregation beyond the resources of current members and catalyzes good stewardship within the community.

An unhealthy endowment is, at best, a mixed blessing. While providing financial resources, it becomes a "crutch" a congregation depends on and undermines good stewardship on an individual and congregational level. It is a source of ongoing conflict within the congregation that undermines vitality.

A healthy endowment is growing and provides increased support for mission and ministry. An unhealthy endowment is shrinking and unable to sustain support.

A healthy endowment creates opportunities for discussion of wealth and good stewardship, particularly regarding planned giving. An unhealthy endowment is shrouded in secrecy and contributes to a culture where "we don't talk about money."
