What is Lutherhill Day Camp?

What is Lutherhill Ministries?

Lutherhill Ministries is a summer camp and year round retreat center that has been based in La Grange, Texas for over 60 years. Lutherhill offers to bring summer camp to kids across the state through local churches and community centers. Lutherhill lives its mission by being a place for all people, of every generation, to experience the love of Christ in unique settings and new ways. For several years now, St. Martin's is excited to be able to provide our community with such a "unique and new" spin on summer ministries!

How is this "Unique and New?"

Lutherhill provides an enthusiastic, ministry-focused staff that is well-trained and maintain American Camp Association standards of practice. This staff is trained to lead a week of camp that resembles, very closely, a week of traditional away-from-home camp. The majority of the camp will be outdoors on St. Martin's large expanse of land. Lunch, closing worship, and mid-day games will be held indoors.

What kinds of activities will be offered?

Our campers will have the opportunity to participate in specially-designed Bible studies, worship, games, crafts, and other special events throughout the week-including a water day. Lutherhill aims to provide crafts that don't end up in the trash. Their crafts, like the ministry, have a purpose, and use.

What is the cost?

At St. Martin's, our youth and family ministries team strive to make sure that we provide quality programming that will positively impact young people's lives. We are offering this five-day camp at the cost of \$85 per camper. Additional siblings are \$80 each.
