We would, however, advise you to purchase your scrubs, lab coat, dissection kit and nitrile gloves for anatomy lab prior to orientation as you will need those supplies the first week of school.

Fall Semester – Dissection Kit, Scrubs, Gloves and Lab Coat

- The Dissection Kit to be purchased for lab (PCS 80119 Anatomy & Embryology) can be purchased through the Kent State online bookstore or Amazon.com and includes:
 - a. Blunt Probe
 - b. Bard-Parker #3 Scalpel Handle
 - c. # 10 Scalpel Blades
 - d. Dissecting Scissors
 - e. Kelly Straight Hemostat
 - f. Tissue Forcep
- Disposable Nitrile gloves for anatomy lab (*Available through Kent State online bookstore or any medical supply store or pharmacy*)
- Full length, cuffed sleeve lab coat (*Available through Kent State online bookstore or any medical supply store*) Please note that this lab coat is necessary for lab and is not the white coat you will receive eventually during the White Coat Ceremony (date TBD.)
- Scrubs (*Not available through Kent State online bookstore*). Scrubs can be any color or print.

Reminder: You will need scrubs, a lab coat, and Nitrile gloves for Anatomy Lab beginning your first week of classes.

Laptop Requirements

Remote Exam Requirements (if necessary to utilize remote exams)

While we are planning for exams to take place at the College, the evolving situation of COVID-19 may prevent this in some instances. There may be a time in which exams are administered remotely. If exams are ever administered remotely, you will want to purchase:

- 1.) A small white board (8.5" x 11" size) with dry erase markers/eraser. Your faculty member **MAY** allow you to use this during an exam administered remotely.
- 2.) A small handheld mirror. This mirror will allow the proctors to see the monitor or surrounding area around the laptop to verify there are no questionable materials available to you during the course of an exam.
