Our regional missionary leaders converged from 4 different countries for our yearly meeting in the Dominican Republic. The first two days were dedicated to the study of the Word and receiving a workshop from Ambassadors of Reconciliation. Each day began with Matins or Morning Prayer and a sermon from one of the visiting pastors. The final two days were spent discussing ongoing challenges. Trends throughout Latin

America were identified as smaller families, accelerated urbanization, personal security and Pentecostalism. Borrowing biblical imagery for the church as a building, our work was identified as being that of strengthening the building and also expanding it through the teaching of the Gospel. We give thanks for the faithfulness and service of each of our missionary leaders and pray that the Lord would prosper our plans.
