


First Reading Acts 9:36-43

Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. ³⁷ At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. ³⁸ Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, "Please come to us without delay." ³⁹ So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. ⁴⁰ Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, "Tabitha, get up." Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. ⁴¹ He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. ⁴² This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. ⁴³ Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.

¹⁵ For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them.


¹⁶ They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat;


*Invitation to Communion

P: Come to the table of grace. Receive the gift of new life.

We will commune beginning with those people on the right side of the sanctuary, facing the altar. You will walk around to the rear of the railing first and fill in all the way around to the front. Once at the railing you may kneel or stand to receive communion. When the last person in the row in front of you has vacated their pew, please follow behind them. Once the right side has communed, the left side begins, and communes as noted above. You will carry your empty cup and discard it in the small basket located at the ends of the first pew. All are welcome to receive the bread and the cup, who believe in Jesus Christ, our Savior, or if you prefer, a prepackaged communion cup is available to pick up on the front left pew. All wafers are low gluten and are approved for celiac disease with less than 20 PPM gluten, they meet the FDA standard for "gluten free".


