The Association of Black Health System Pharmacists believes in the ability for pharmacists to establish a standard of excellence for health care with a primary focus on Black and minority communities, and for that care to be fair, accessible, and appropriate. This mission statement aligns very closely with my own aspirations that brought me to pharmacy school.

There is a deep-rooted mistrust of health care professionals within the Black community, stemming from a history of unethical experimentation and treatment executed by White practitioners on Black people. As a result of this, it is common for members of the Black community (consciously and unconsciously) wanting to avoid hospitals, doctor visits, and sometimes issues regarding their health altogether. However, this skepticism does not stop my people from becoming sick nor depending on medication to enhance their quality of life. I've always found it to be extremely important that I become involved in bridging this gap with my hesitant, underserved community to encourage not only their ability to advocate for their health needs, but also their ability to manage their disease state and associated treatments with comfort and confidence.

Prior to my matriculation at Howard University College of Pharmacy, I spent time teaching math and science in South Philadelphia, in a particularly underserved section of my home city. My 4th grade students had not had a consistent teacher since the 1st grade and, as a result, their expectations of me were quite low initially. In addition to their dislike towards school, many of them had unstable environments at home and were under a lot of stress that ten-year-old kids in more privileged parts of the city never endure. I realized that my students didn't only need me to be a dependable teacher, but they often needed me to be a social worker, a psychologist, and a parent too. They needed major convincing of their worth and their capabilities before they could truly flourish. Each day, I made sure to be present and to meet them at their level, all while encouraging them to do the same. Eventually, my students were more consistent and enthusiastic even with participating in class, trying to solve problems, and completing their homework.

I view my students as my first set of patients. Regardless of their skepticism of school and of me, I refused to give up on them because I understand the value of education, especially for children in underserved communities. And as an aspiring ambulatory care pharmacist, I will never allow my patients to forget their worthiness of being healthy, of access to information and of understanding that information to make important decisions and life changes to benefit their health. I am filled with a genuine care for my community and communities of color; I promise to always carry this sentiment and allow it to further guide me through my interests of ambulatory care, medical writing and education as I continue throughout my pharmacy journey to ensure that black and minority communities benefit from what I do.
