Briefly describe what qualifies the candidate for the award

I am named after my many greats grandfather James Garrard, the second governor of Kentucky. My Appalachian roots pervade my life. My father was born and raised in Manchester, Kentucky, and met my mother, from Paducah, Kentucky, while they were obtaining their bachelor's degrees at Berea College, Berea, Kentucky. My father went on to obtain a Ph.D. in physical chemistry at the University of Florida, and enjoy a career as a National Aeronautics and Space Administration research scientist. My mother worked in family planning with the Planned Parenthood Federation of America, and later as a counselor for pre-release individuals in the state of Ohio prison system. I think my father's and mother's attributes as researchers, and helping, giving people, and the many life experiences they provided have instilled in me my great interest toward a helping medical profession.

My family spent many summers in Kentucky visiting family and friends and helping out on my aunt's and uncle's farm just outside of Richmond, Kentucky. My grandfather worked for the federal government in soil conservation and traveled much of Appalachia. Two of his brothers graduated medical school from Vanderbilt University and practiced medicine in the South. I have traveled throughout Kentucky, Tennessee, and West Virginia, and interacted and worked with those in need. I am determined to further develop my skills and knowledge to be in a better position to help people in impoverished regions, the have-nots.

Much of my life has involved medical studies. I obtained my doctor of medicine degree from the University of Texas Medical Branch, Galveston, Texas, and had an earlier career as a nuclear medicine researcher in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. There, I resided in and was heavily involved with the impoverished West Philadelphia part of the city. In West Philadelphia, there are few resources and much need. I helped prepare meals at local soup kitchens, and volunteered in community holiday and other social gatherings. In the Our Closet community clothing shop, I helped organize and distribute donated clothing for community members in need. Through a local church, I became certified as a volunteer tax preparation assistant and helped many community members prepare their taxes. I also received training from the National Council for Community Behavioral Healthcare as a mental health first aid volunteer for both youths and adults and used my training to help with West Philadelphia mental health problems including anxiety and depression, and the related, intertwined substance use disorders. People need hope. They need improved schools and training so they are empowered for better jobs and better living. I am now furthering my training, in community pharmacy, to be of more help to those in need. I plan to be the pharmacist in charge of a local community pharmacy in an underserved area in the South and each day help those of the region with their healthcare, and life coping needs.

In my Howard University pharmacy school years, I have strengthened my knowledge base, continued to serve the community, and worked to better prepare myself for community pharmacy. I am on the Dean's Honor Roll for numerous semesters, and was fortunate to be inducted into the Rho Chi Academic Honor Society where I am vice president. I was also proud to be elected vice president of my P3, third-year pharmacy class. As a certified vaccine administrator, I have volunteered at many vaccination clinics. I have also done blood pressure checks, blood glucose and Hemoglobin A1C testing, and provided health and wellness information at many community health fairs. As a Howard University Alternative Spring Break team leader, I helped train my undergraduate student team for community volunteering and helped in fundraising activities. As the Howard University Residence Life Graduate Resident Assistant leader of the Axis dormitory student housing, I have helped to organize many HIV testing sessions. I advertised for the sessions, helped all participants fill out HIV testing forms, and was sure to maintain student privacy and confidentiality. In addition, as the current Office of Residence Life head of the dormitory, I continue to help plan, manage, and run many student activities, and lend help, advice, and student counseling whenever needed.

All my experiences and healthcare studies have helped to shape my professional goals and career plans. As a community pharmacist in a southern underserved area, I will maintain a firm knowledge of modern medical practice and the most advanced pharmaceutical therapies and treatment techniques. I will continue to do my best for my patients and my community.
