Dr Miller earned his MD from the University of Southern California School of Medicine, Los Angeles, California. He completed residency training at Tripler Army Medical Center Honolulu, Hawaii and fellowship in Hematology-Oncology at Walter Reed Army Medical Center, Washington, DC. He is Board Certified in Medical Oncology, Hematology and Internal Medicine and is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians and a Fellow of The American Society of Clinical Oncology. He served for 30 years in the US Army Medical Department, serving as Commander, 3rd Combat Support Hospital, Nuremberg, Germany and completing his service as the Chief Consultant to the US Army Surgeon General. After retiring from active duty, he completed 9 years as Chief of Hematology-Oncology at Kaiser Medical Center, Honolulu, Hawaii. He has served on the Hawaii Society of Clinical Oncology Board of Directors since 2002 and served as President for seven of those years. He is actively involved at the national level with the American Society of Clinical Oncology having served on the Clinical Practice Committee, Government Relations Committee, State Affiliate Council – including serving as Chair – and has actively participated in all of ASCO's Advocacy Summits. He holds a clinical appointment to the University of Hawaii Cancer Center. He has been an active supporter of patient choice for end-of-life care for the people of the state of Hawaii as a member of Doctors for Dignity. Since January 2019 he has assumed the role of Program Director for Kaiser Hawaii's Medical Aid in Dying Program.
