CALL TO WORSHIP – LESSON 4

Hold up the appropriate icon at the start of each element of worship. Describe what is being pictured in each one. Have children help as much as possible



“Oh come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the LORD, our Maker! For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand.” Use motions.



First Catechism – Questions 1-6



Sing “O Worship the King” with hand motions. Sing other praise songs they may all know. Choose your favorites.



Read Revelation 21:21-22:5 from *The Message* as printed in the main lesson. Read this with excitement, enthusiasm and amazement.



If your students miss the Tithes & Offering part of corporate worship, have a system that works so that all the teachers do the same thing each week.



Revelation means “eye-opener,” and God had the disciple John write down all that He showed him about what will happen in the future. Some of Revelation is difficult for us to understand because it is about heaven, a place that we have never seen. One thing is certain: in heaven we will worship Jesus our King forever and ever. Remind children that worship is one thing we can begin to do on earth that we know we will do in heaven.



Have children repeat the prayer one line at a time as you pray: “Thank You, God, for everything. Help us learn to worship You with all our hearts. In Jesus’s name, amen.



“‘Surely I am coming soon.’ Amen. Come, Lord Jesus! The grace of the Lord Jesus be with you all” (Rev. 22:20-21).

What did we learn today about God?

- 1) Jesus is our God and King, and we will worship Him forever in heaven.
- 2) God designed heaven as a place to worship.
- 3) God has done all that we need through Jesus to make us ready for heaven. (Give a clear gospel presentation in this lesson.)

ACTIVITIES:

- 1) Have children draw what they think heaven looks like as you read the description from Revelation.
- 2) Practice the memory verse.
- 3) If time allows, complete the coloring sheet.
