

Call to Worship Lesson 4: King Jesus Will Be Worshiped Forever

Memory Verse:

Oh, come let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the Lord our Maker!
For He is our God, and we are the people of His pasture, and the sheep of
His hand. – Psalm 95:6-7

Catechism:

1. **Q.** Who made you?
A. God

2. **Q.** What else did God make?
A. God made all things.

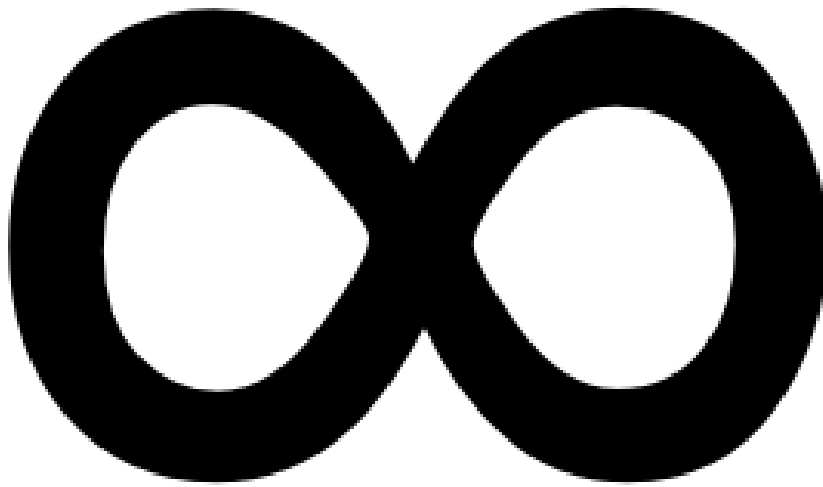
Discussion: What did we learn today about God?

- 1) Jesus is our God and King, and we will worship Him forever in heaven.
- 2) God designed heaven as a place to worship.
- 3) God has done all that we need through Jesus to make us ready for heaven.
(Give a clear gospel presentation in this lesson.)

Activity #1: What is forever?

Materials Needed: Chalk, string, or tape

- Draw the infinity sign (see below) on the ground with chalk or make it with string or tape on the floor in the classroom.
- Line the children up and have them take turns walking on it. As they walk, ask them where the beginning is and where the end is.
- After everyone has had a turn walking on the infinity sign, discuss how hard it is to imagine forever, because we think of time with a beginning (birth) and an ending (death), but Jesus reigns outside of time and space because He reigns forever. The Bible tells us God has no beginning or end. He is eternal.



Activity #2: Hail King Jesus!

Materials Needed: Copies of the crown, “jewel” stickers, markers or crayons

- Before class, make a copy of the crown for each child and gather “jewel” stickers, preferably half a sheet for each child.
- In class, remind the children that we are called to worship Jesus because He is our King. As our King, Jesus is worthy of our worship. What are some ways we can worship Jesus?
- Have the children form a megaphone with their hands and shout, “Hail, hail, King Jesus!”
- Have the children bow down before Jesus. Talk about why Jesus is special and how His Kingdom is different than earthly kingdoms.
- Have the children color and decorate the crowns with sticker jewels.
