

ANNOUNCES NEW 2024 SPEAKER SERIES: TRAILBLAZING TALKS

Lineup includes photographers, nature enthusiasts, scientists and more. Series subscriptions go on sale Monday, May 22, 2023.

Kansas City, MO – Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts announces a new inspiring and exciting speaker series – **Trailblazing Talks** – which is made possible by the Teresa and Tom Walsh Family Foundation. Beginning in 2024, the new series features five presenters, including an oceanographer, sports photographer, paleoanthropologist and others.

Each event is illustrated by stunning imagery and gripping video footage shown on the Kauffman Center's 22.5' x 40' screen in Muriel Kauffman Theatre. A brief audience Q&A session follows each presentation.

Trailblazing Talks connects Kansas Citians to a deep roster of talented speakers that includes renowned photographers, adventurers, authors, scientists and filmmakers. Presenters share insights about the world around us, helping us to move forward thoughtfully, strive to solve big problems, bridge the distances between us and lift us up – one story at a time.

"In this new series, you can count on close encounters with high-caliber adventurers and photojournalists like those you have experienced in the National Geographic Live series. In addition, our new partnership allows us to incorporate some variations that we believe this audience and our community will find to be engaging, exciting, innovative and, in many ways, 'trailblazing'," said President and CEO Paul Schofer.

The lineup for the new series includes wide-ranging topics presented live on stage. From people on the front lines, you'll learn how Neanderthals failed (and why we need to know), explore America's favorite game (and women's roles in baseball) and discover steps that can be taken to address the survival of our stressed oceans.

The Kauffman Center has curated speakers specifically for Kansas City from the Changemaker Speaker Series. Changemaker provides top experts from a variety of creative, STEM and entrepreneurial fields who are dynamic storytellers that share their bold ideas and fresh perspectives to spark creativity, foster community and inspire action.

Ella Al-Shamahi, Paleoanthropologist 2% Neanderthal: Redrawing Our Family Tree January 9, 2024, at 7:30 p.m. Evolutionary Biologist Ella Al-Shamahi may be the most unconventional paleoanthropologist working today. These days she wears three hats: leading expeditions into unstable and hostile territories to un-earth fossil records before they are wiped from the planet; as a TV Host guiding our journey around the planet to understand how it's changing; and hitting open mic nights at stand-up festivals worldwide to keep from going mad from all of it. To chart a more sustainable future for ourselves, Al-Shamahi believes we need to understand why our recent ancestors failed.

Michael Davie, Journalist Documenting the Red Zone February 20, 2024, at 7:30 p.m.

Join award-winning documentary filmmaker Michael Davie as he takes you on a journey through stories of faith, resilience and courage. With nearly 30 years of experience working in war zones, refugee camps and hostile territories, Davie has learned to let go of fear and embrace uncertainty to capture the most memorable moments. Witness the power of the human spirit in the most surprising places — inside a South African prison, on a mountainside in Rwanda where brave park rangers risk everything to guard threatened mountain gorillas and on the banks of the Ganges river, to name a few.

Jean Fruth, Sports Photographer
From Sandlots to Stadiums: Inside America's Favorite Pastime
March 12, 2024, at 7:30 p.m.

Rather than a seat at the table, she'll take one down the third baseline. With this bold approach, sports photographer Jean Fruth has carved a unique niche in the world of sports journalism. As one of the few women to break through to cover the Majors, she has brought a fresh perspective to America's favorite game. Fruth's passion for baseball is infectious, from the storied ballparks of the U.S. to grassroots leagues across Route 66 and beyond. Beyond simply covering the game, Fruth's work has also focused on how women have made their mark in baseball. From the diamond to the owner's box, she documents the inspiring stories of women who have broken barriers and shattered stereotypes in the sport. Drawing on her extensive interviews with baseball legends, the all-women league that inspired the film *A League of Their Own*, and the trailblazers who are energizing the game today, she paints a vivid picture of the sport's rich history and exciting future.

David McLain, Photographer The Blue Zones: Unlocking the Secrets of Longevity April 23, 2024, at 7:30 p.m.

Discover the secrets of the Blue Zones, where people around the planet regularly live vibrant and healthy lives beyond 100 years old. Photographer David McLain has spent

15 years working alongside author Dan Buettner to study the habits and rituals of centenarians in these five geographic locations: Loma Linda, California; the Nicoya peninsula of Costa Rica; Sardinia, Italy; Ikaria, Greece and Okinawa, Japan. Through personal anecdotes and scientific research, McLain shares how adopting practices they share — oceans apart — can add eight to 10 quality years to our own lives. Join us on this journey toward a long, well-lived life.

Sylvia Earle, Oceanographer Saving Our Blue Planet, One Hope Spot at a Time May 21, 2024, at 7:30 p.m.

With more than 7,500 hours logged underwater and the wisdom that comes from working in just about every facet of ocean conservation — from assuming the helm as the first female Chief Scientist of NOAA to designing and engineering deep water rovers — Dr. Sylvia Earle's wish to save the ocean is gaining traction, one "Hope Spot" at a time. Working beyond borders and ideologies, this early TED Prize winner advises heads of state on critical marine protection legislation and crisis response. She strives to help the rest of us understand the consequences of everything we put into — and take out of — the ocean. Most importantly, she believes that although humans are largely responsible for many stresses on the ocean, we also are its best hope for survival.
