**BEEing Prepared with Best Practices on Social Media**

It is so exciting to share the work our Lord is doing through Lutheran Women in Mission. As you share the work of your local LWML society and zone, please **bee** aware of a few key steps when you post to social media platforms. Three key steps are to **bee** prepared, **bee** active, and **bee** monitoring.

To **bee** prepared, you must understand the why, who, what, where, how, and when of the post. The why of a post is our LWML mission that we joyfully proclaim Christ and help others honor God. It is important that we know who we want to engage with our posts. Who are you trying to engage - young women, mature ladies, or culturally diverse people? Different post types (photos, stories, videos, text, Facebook live) appeal to different audiences and decide which type may better support the mission. Facebook live works great for Bible study. Some platforms appeal more to different audiences. Does your group or zone have a policy and strategy for sharing information on social media? If not, write it down especially for the person who will be serving in this role after you. Have a plan and schedules which will help **bee** consistent.


Now that you are prepared, **bee** active. Follow the plan you made and post often to let your audience know that you are constantly working toward the mission. **Bee** consistent with your strategy. Update the strategy to keep pace with changes in your audience or to focus on a different audience. Sometimes, the strategy was better in your thoughts than in use. Make those adjustments.

**Bee** monitoring your posts for shares and engagements. If it's not what you were expecting, maybe you need to revisit your plan and strategy. Your followers want to interact with you. Read the comments and respond as appropriate in a timely fashion. Remember to consult your pastoral counselors for scripturally based comments.

## DISTRICT MISSION GRANTS : Fall Update

### Mission Grant #2 : The Food and Clothing Co-Op Concordia Seminary, Fort Wayne -- \$5,000

#### Prayers Requested!

*Many grant proposals were not elected due to a limit in funding. Although we could not give them funds, we support them through prayers. As every day brings new reports of war and terror in Eastern Europe, let's remember to pray for the Faith and Hope Center in Novosibirsk, Siberia.*

At Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana, nearly 60% of the students are married, second career with families.

When they decide to leave their jobs to come to the seminary, these students no longer have the same financial flow of funds as before, but they and their families do continue to have the same needs.

The Food and Clothing Co-op is currently able to supply from 80-85% of all food and household needs each month at no cost to the student.

Seminarians and their families volunteer to work at the Food Co-op each month. In exchange they are allowed one shopping day each week.

This \$5,000 grant will be used to purchase only perishable food items each month which are then given directly to the students and their families at no cost.

### Mission Grant #3 : Financial Grant-in-Aid for Seminary and Church Worker Students -- \$5,000

The LCMS provides education for its church

workers through the Concordia University System located across the country on 7 campuses and through two LCMS Seminaries.

Current costs of such education are extremely high and alternative funding from other sources is becoming more limited, thereby preventing some from completing their preparation for these church callings.

The LCMS Southern District currently has four young men studying to be church workers.

### FROM AROUND THE LWML LOUISIANA-MISSISSIPPI DISTRICT

**"WHAT'S YOUR 80?" with Holy Trinity Lutheran/New Life Lutheran in Covington/Folsom, LA**  
 LWML is celebrating 80 years of God's Grace from 1942-2022. In thanksgiving for these 80 years, Holy Trinity/New Life women have chosen to sponsor local organizations monthly from July through December 2022, and collect items for them.

- In July we collected well over 80 school supplies for 3 schools.
- In August our recipient was Giving Hope Retreat, located in Lacombe, which is a faith-based organization for men that provides rescue from homelessness to recovery and reengagement into the community. We collected men's underwear and toiletry items.
- September-Discovery Renew, serving the needs of foster care or placed with court appointed relatives where we will collect diapers and pull ups, baby wipes, children's underwear and socks.
- October-Safe Harbor, serving survivors and their children who are victims of domestic abuse, collecting women's toiletry items.
- November- we are planning to highlight our military veterans, specifics to be determined.
- December-create cards plus a small ornament for shut-ins and nursing home residents.

God has richly blessed us and we are able to share God's love and grace with these recipients. Our congregations have been very supportive of our projects.

**"WHAT'S YOUR 80?" with St. Paul Lutheran in Hammond, LA**

The women at St. Paul along with congregation members are doing numerous activities for their mission projects. They collected money to purchase Christian books for children in Ukraine through the Lutheran Heritage Foundation. They have pledged and extra \$80 to the district mites, \$80 to Forged by Fire and Kids Helping Kids, missions of The Village Lutheran Church, \$80 x 2 for the Stinnett family in Ethiopia, and a holiday event using old greeting/Christmas cards and repurposing them to create messages along with Mustard Seed Devotions for shut-ins.

These are some ideas for your societies to brainstorm how you can involve your sisters in Christ along with congregation members to focus on the mission of LWML; *As Lutheran Women in Mission, we joyfully proclaim Christ, support missions, and equip women to honor God by serving others.*

In August, we delivered the collected socks to the Shreveport-Bossier Rescue Mission to be used to help the homeless in our community.



**RETREAT:**

*Verb – to withdraw to a quiet or secluded place*

*Noun – a quiet or secluded place in which one can rest and relax; a period of seclusion for the purposes of prayer and meditation*



In this world of take charge attitudes and pressing toward the future, we often think of the word “RETREAT” as a sign of failure.

It makes us think of giving up or hiding away to lick our wounds. In the military, it can sometimes even signal cowardice. As Christians, however, we need to reevaluate the term “RETREAT” as a source of strength.

Take a look at the definitions at the top of this article.

“RETREAT” is really about three key components: quiet, rest, and prayer.

At this time of year, especially, it is easy to become overwhelmed. We all have church activities, school activities for the kids, holiday plans, family coming to visit, Christmas gifts to buy, decorations to put up, and the list just goes on. It is at times like these that we can really appreciate those key components of a “RETREAT”. Lucky for us we have one available in a few months on April 28-30, 2023.

The 2023 Spring Christian Life Retreat is all about focusing on our spiritual journeys. It is a chance to join with our LWML sisters to focus on the Word, share encouragement, and meditate on our relationship with God. Taking place at the beautiful Wesley Center in Woodworth, LA there will be plenty of opportunities for quiet, rest & prayer, but also a good helping of fun and fellowship. We will have Bible Studies and nature walks, quiet contemplations and exciting activities. **As such, while some might attack with shouts of “Charge”, I would joyfully stand on the rooftops to yell “RETREAT!! RETREAT!!” “RETREAT” to God’s refuge, our mighty fortress, where we can be still and know that he is God. (Ps 46 paraphrased)**

Therefore, I challenge you to build excitement and make plans to attend the 2023 Retreat; start talking about the retreat and put together a group to travel together. There is even a skit available on the district website to help raise interest. Get your registration in early. (The first 30 registrants will receive a bonus surprise.) Forms are available on the district website and in this newsletter. You might even ask your loved ones to make this your Christmas gift. It has been nearly 6 years since we had an in-person Retreat; let’s make this one to remember!


