For more than 100 years, potatoes have been grown in the rich and fertile soil of the Red River Valley.

The Northern Plains Potato Growers Association was organized in 1946 by a handful of potato growers who felt the valley's potato industry needed to be more united. Since then, more than 600 grower members have evolved into about 200 larger and more consolidated grower members.

Today, the Northern Plains region is one of the nation's largest potato producing areas, producing volume for four major potato markets; chip, fresh, seed and frozen processing. NPPGA works for its grower members in the areas of research, communication, market support, advocacy, promotion and advertising, education and legislation.

Potatoes grown in the Red River Valley of Minnesota and North Dakota are the highest quality found anywhere. It is with pride and dedication that the potato growers in this area combine a superior work ethic, modern, state-of-the-art equipment, significant research, and facilities to produce excellent quality potatoes.

Potatoes have been a powerful part of generations of families and a staple in the daily lives of our communities.



The Northern Plains Region

The Red River Valley of the North, and the region surrounding it, is one of the most fertile farming regions in the world. With its nutrient-rich black earth, there is no better place to grow delicious, hearty potatoes.

Red and yellow potato varieties are grown for fresh consumption, russet varieties for frozen potato products and round white potatoes for producing potato chips.



HOW POTATOES ARE GROWN



BEDDING

Tractors pull cultivators to create and shape beds that allow space for potato growth, create irrigation furrows and control weeds.



PLANTING

Planters place seed tubers—often cut pieces of whole seed potatoes—in the ground.



SPROUT DEVELOPMENT

Small indentations on the seed tubers called "eyes" begin to sprout and grow upward toward the soil's surface.



VEGETATIVE GROWTH

Above ground, leaves and stems begin to form from emerged sprouts. Under the surface, roots and stolons, or new baby tubers, are forming.



10 TUBER INITIATION

Tubers, or potatoes, start to form at stolon tips.



O TUBER BULKING

The potatoes begin to grow as the tubers become the main depository of carbs and nutrients for the plant. Flowers appear on the vines above ground.



O VINE DESICCATE

Vines above ground turn yellow and leaves drop. Potatoes reach their maximum size and their skins set.



HARVESTING

When the potatoes are ready, tractors pull mechanical harvesters that dig up potatoes and transfer them to a truck to be hauled to storage or a processing facility.


IMPACT OF POTATOES IN THE NORTHERN PLAINS REGION
