

"While you have the light, believe in the light so that you may become children of light." Jesus said this, then went away and was hidden from them." (John 12:36)

I saw my kids 2 full days this past year and that was during a very difficult funeral service with my son-in law, as his father suddenly passed away. So, I saw the light! I felt inspired this past week and Carol and I have decided that **now was the time** we go see them for a while. No reason but to simply "be" with them. It's time. We didn't even have to stay in their homes... we brought our own. If Covid is a problem, we will sit outside on chairs 6 feet a part. Funny thing is... the girls agreed that this will work!

Over the years in over-functioning in ministry I have forgotten that my family is my life, and everything else comes second as far. This is what is important to me.

A loving family is a treasure from God. If God has blessed you with a close knit, supportive clan, offer a word of thanks to the Lord because God has given you one of God's most precious earthly possessions. And it's your responsibility to praise God for that gift and to act accordingly.

In this scripture verse from John, it is stating that Jesus, in a very literal sense, is telling people that His earthly ministry is coming to a close. Their opportunity to hear and respond to Him is slipping away (John 12:23). I realize that my girls and my Grandson, Grayson, are growing up and that we haven't been there this past year to see them in this light. I was not going to miss this period in our family life.

Those who reject God's words and Jesus' message are risking being left in the darkness (John 12:35). More generally, Jesus is speaking to anyone who hears the gospel or sees the myriad evidence available for truths about God. He's warning all people that only those who become "children of light" can avoid being overtaken by darkness.

What has this virus taken from you that is a vital part of your life and relationship with God's other children? Is it time to do something about it?
