I have heard from some of the families whose children had to postpone their BIG events, but still found time for these projects. I don't have everyone's accomplishments, so if someone is left out of this list, do let me know.

Sophie Culver (originally scheduled for May 2). She finished the after-school program tutoring at Norma Coombs School when school was closed for this year, but she continued with a new project--making a portable "free little library" for the school during the coming months, and will deliver it to the school in the next academic year.

Emett Mendel (May 21 & 22, 2021). From fall to April, when schools closed, Emett worked with a local elementary school helping a teacher prepare materials for her first grade class.

Michael Gerst (June 20). Michael worked with the Challenger team of special needs children in his little league. He was able to help during the opening game, but since the league closed, he is looking for another project.

For Mother's Day shabbat weekend, 26 families baked and delivered over 100 FREE challahs to PJTC community members who had ordered from us. As always, I'm so grateful to work with pro baker and educator Aaren Heller, who did a fabulous job over zoom, teaching families who had never made challah "the right way." I even learned a new braiding method! My little toddler helped me bake ours--and it was so beautiful to see the faces of those who received such a special mitzvah-filled delivery from one of our young people. I'm proud that PJTC is able to provide programming like this where young people learn new skills and can continue to connect with every generation--even while practicing social distancing.

On May 17, USY and Kadima created and participated in some online Jewish holiday trivia. Imagine 50 kids on zoom all commenting on the answers, debating each other, and making jokes as we went along. Even some parents got in on the action! As I type this, our USY teen leaders are getting ready to attend Far West USY Regional Convention ("Zoomvention") May 22-25. We will follow that after Shavuot with our own chapter elections and end of year programming. I look forward to sharing the results of these elections and the names of our newly elected teen leaders in next month's issue of the Flame.

Our book clubs are in full swing now, and as more young people move out of school mode and into summer mode, they are welcome to join us any time--we meet every Friday. Board Report

The PJTC Board of Directors met on May 26 via Zoom and heard a report from the clergy on High Holy Day contingency possibilities. The clergy surveyed some members to determine the aspects of High Holy Days they deemed most important. In the coming months, the clergy and a committee will explore the possibilities, which may include holding services at one or more outside locations or holding services in the sanctuary and social hall along with a satellite location. The clergy anticipates continuing to livestream services for those who do not feel comfortable or cannot attend, should the option to meet in person be allowed come September. In addition to services, other High Holy Day programming such as study sessions could be held via Zoom to allow for congregant interaction.

The board also learned that all four summer camps slated to use the temple facilities will not take place, and furthermore, Weizmann Day School is closing permanently, which will affect rental income. B'nai Simcha might continue to use the facility over summer in a limited capacity.

The board members also offered congratulations, hopes and wishes for Rabbi John Carrier on his hiring as PJTC's permanent senior rabbi.

Social Justice Committee

Around the country, faith-based organizations are committing to a nonpartisan drive to encourage their membership to become informed about issues in the upcoming elections, to make certain eligible voters are registered, and to encourage 100% of their congregants and members to vote. Faithful Democracy and LA Voice are among the groups linking synagogues, churches, mosques and other faith centers to this drive, including circulating petitions, and letters promoting increased participation in the upcoming primaries and elections. The Social Justice Committee here at PJTC is in sync with and supports these important initiatives.

Not only are the national contests of extraordinary importance, but local and state elections, initiative choices, and the obstacles to voting compounded by the covid-19 pandemic are matters that affect all of us as Jews and as citizens. Even the innovations designed to make voting more convenient that were instituted with the California primary early in March ended up causing widespread confusion and uncertainty. And that was in the pre-pandemic twilight for which many of us are nostalgic.

The Social Justice Committee has identified the 2020 Election and Voting as our major focus in the upcoming five months--an incredibly brief time for us as a country in the midst of so many destabilizing realities. To help PJTC members navigate the issues and any changes in the process of voting, the Social Justice Committee will amalgamate and communicate to our fellow PJTC members information gleaned from nonpartisan faith-based and secular organizations (think League of Women Voters).

In the coming weeks, we will be reaching out to you in order to create the pathways for distributing this information most effectively. Our goal is to be supportive and encouraging, as we also strive through events and programs to be educational and motivational, so that 100 % of our fellow PJTC members can participate on November 3, 2020.

Please watch Temple announcements for the dates of zoom meetings and opportunities to get involved with our work: "To respond to societal conditions and contemporary issues based on traditional Jewish values and the prophetic admonition--*Tzedek, tzedek tirdofe*, Justice, justice shall you pursue.

Friends in Deed - Doing Together What We Cannot Do Alone

Friends in Deed (FID) is an interfaith organization that provides supportive services to meet basic human needs, so our homeless and at-risk neighbors can rebuild their lives.

Your PJTC Sisterhood continues to support our chosen *Tzedakah* project – Friends in Deed Women's Room, and has recently made a \$500.00 donation to support the organization. Although most FID services are temporarily suspended, the Women's Room is providing some limited services, including showers, laundry, rest area and bagged lunches. Up until recently, Sisterhood participated with a once-a-month luncheon delivery for approximately 35 homeless women, our members bringing fresh fruit, salad, vegetarian soup and a main dish, and we are committed to providing this service again when it is safe to do so. If this is an activity that interests you, please contact Debby Singer.

When fully operative, the Women's Room program includes supportive services and basic needs: a shower, laundry and healthy food. In addition, women enjoy access to computers and telephones, a place to nap, arts and crafts, nature and cultural field trips, games and fresh clothing. They look forward to the monthly professional hair styling, chair massage and birthday celebrations. Through individual attention and educational and recreational programs, women begin making choices to improve their lives. Equally important, by socializing and helping one another, they build a sense of community—a major element in their success and prevention of homelessness.

Other programs offered through Friends in Deed include:

*Food Pantry provides food assistance to low-income and no-income families in the greater Pasadena/Altadena area.

*Bad Weather Shelter (BWS) provides shelter and dinner for homeless individuals during the winter season.

Save the Date !! Shabbat, June 12

The name(s) of winners of the Fuchs Award will be announced during services on Shabbat, June 12, at 7:30 PM via streaming.

This is a prestigious award given to one or more LBSRS graduates, usually during the graduation ceremony. This year is certainly different, but the award will be delivered to the winner(s) shortly afterwards. It consists of a certificate and a sum of money, donated in 2000 by our beloved members Morton and Ilona Fuchs. The name(s) of the winners will be published in the July issue.

*Homeless Prevention program provides short-term and medium-term rental support, as well as move-in assistance, to individuals and families on the brink of becoming homeless with early 70 individuals and families benefitting from this program each year.

*Street Outreach Program team identifies chronically homeless individuals, on the streets of Pasadena, and works to build trust and relationships with them. The team's primary goal is to enter these folks into the Coordinated Entry System, which is the pathway to permanent supportive housing.

Sharing a message from FID Executive Director and PJTC member Rabbi Joshua Levine Grater: "We are living in uncertain times, and they are even scarier for the most vulnerable in our community. I want to thank you all for your commitment and caring during the most difficult time. As Proverbs teaches us, Whoever is generous to the poor lends to the Lord, and God will repay them for their deed. We know that people want to help in this critical time. Since we can't know what kinds of food or needed supplies will be most critical at any given moment, please consider a generous donation so we can continue to provide as much care and compassion as we possibly can."

Weizmann Day School

In early February, Weizmann's Board of Trustees announced its difficult decision to close the school after the school year ends in June. After 36 successful years, there just was not a sufficient enrollment to start another year.

While still sad about that decision, Weizmann (like the rest of the world) had to confront the COVID-19 pandemic. Weizmann's staff was called upon to do something they had never done before: to teach and run the school from their homes.

The results have been inspiring.

Since March 16, Weizmann's dedicated teachers have been meeting with students online each day and teaching their required curricula. Students see their teachers and classmates via Zoom. They talk about their feelings and work together.

To date, teachers (and "guest readers") have read stories, guided older students through completion of their science fair projects (including a first-place win by Eden G. in the L.A. County Virtual Science Fair and an invitation for Isabel L. to attend a prestigious conference!), and used creative methods to remotely teach social studies, writing, math, Hebrew, Jewish Studies, art, and music.

In addition, teachers and administrators maintain regular contact with their students' parents and caregivers. Mindful of the stressful situation in many homes right now, Weizmann has made it a priority to communicate and be flexible. They send parents a weekly schedule of Zoom calls and projects, and update them regularly about their children's progress. Parents have expressed appreciation for the commitment that teachers and staff have shown.

Weizmann is grateful to have support from families and community members during this difficult time!


