PJTC Social Justice Committee Will Host a Webinar on Proposition 15 – the Schools & Communities First Initiative

California's Proposition 15 – the Schools & Communities First initiative on the November ballot – will be the subject of a webinar discussion on Sunday, September 13th at 10:00 AM sponsored by PJTC's Social Justice Committee. It is free and open to the public.

The discussion will be led by Veronica Carrizales, Policy Director of California Calls, the statewide coalition of community-based organizations that is leading Proposition 15 campaign.

Proposition 15 would close property tax loopholes on the largest corporations in California to reclaim \$12 billion every year for California's K-12 schools, community colleges, local governments, and essential services.

Audience members will be able to ask questions about Proposition 15, including the campaign, where the additional revenue will come from, how it will be used, its proponents and opponents, and other topics.

This new revenue would be generated by requiring that commercial and industrial properties worth more than \$3 million are taxed at fair market value. Proposition 15 would protect homeowners and renters, small businesses, and agricultural land

from any property tax increase. It also includes new small business tax cuts on business personal property taxes.

According to Carrizales: "According to a recent analysis, 10% of the biggest, most valuable commercial and industrial property owners would generate 92% of the new revenue, illustrating the fact that top corporations in the state have gotten a free ride for decades at the expense of Californians."

Polling has shown that 58% of California's likely voters support Proposition 15. But California's largest corporations are expected to spend hundreds of millions of dollars to defeat Proposition 15, including television ads and direct mail. As a result, the battle over Proposition 15 is likely to be the most expensive statewide ballot campaign in California history.

The new revenues from Proposition 15 will go to local school districts and local governments in every California county to invest in things like:

- · Reducing class sizes
- · Expanding health care services
- · Fighting homelessness
- Hiring firefighters and updating their equipment
- · Improving the safety of our drinking water

Preparing for future disasters such as wildfire, pandemic or earthquakes.

Veronica Carrizales serves on the Board of Directors for the California Budget & Policy Center and Human Impact Partners. The Social Justice Committee will be sending all PJTC members a link to the Zoom meeting for the event. For further information, contact Peter Dreier at dreier@oxy.edu.

On Tuesday, October 13th the Social Justice Committee will sponsor a nonpartisan discussion of the ballot initiatives, with pro and con positions offered by The League of Women Voters. Look for more information in the PJTC Thursday emails.

The SJC is urging PJTC congregants and friends to get involved in restoring voting rights where they have been unfairly revoked or suppressed. Three nonpartisan efforts offer ways to make a difference through post card and letter writing, phone calling and text messaging: Vote Forward (https://wotefwd.org), Reclaim our Vote (https://www.whenweallvote.org/), and Whenweallvote.org (https://www.whenweallvote.org/).

Zoom together post-carding events offer a sociable way to join others in accomplishing this work, and the Social Justice Committee will host these sessions on Sunday, August 30 at 10 a.m.; Monday, September 7 at 10 a.m. (Labor Day), and Wednesday, September 23 at 7 p.m. Contact Susan Auerbach at sauerbach2063@sbcglobal.net with subject line "ROV postcarding."





Board Report

The Board of Directors met on August 24 via Zoom. Rabbi John Carrier presented a comprehensive outline of High Holy Day planning. The services will be composed of a combination of livestreamed and recorded components to ensure fluidity. Youth services will also be offered virtually. Congregants will receive a booklet outlining the associated High Holy Day events, including breakout sessions and discussion groups they may join online. PJTC also launched an "app" that enables congregants to receive daily Elul messages and participate in a forum.

The board also heard an LBSRS update. Currently, about 50 percent of the families are re-enrolled in Hebrew school. This is consistent with some other area synagogues and expected to change once in-person classes can be held again, particularly among the families with young children.

The board voted to pay back a loan taken out for Centennial expenses given that the anticipated events will be postponed until health conditions change.
