Your Voice Counts

There's a principle rabbis sometimes use in making decisions about Jewish law and practice known as "*puk v'hazi*" – "Go Out and

Observe." It comes up at least twice that I know about, once when rabbis were trying to figure out the proper blessing to say when drinking water (Berakhot 45a) and what width of wooden post you need to make an eruv, a domain for Shabbat community (Eruvin 14b). In both cases, the answer was: Take a survey of what Jewish people are doing day to day, and then you will have your answer.

This, to me, is the humble acknowledgement that even though we strive to live lives of holiness, holiness itself requires an appreciation for lived human experience. Holiness is not theoretical. It is not achieved in a vacuum. The holiness of the Jewish people is the sum total of the striving of all Jewish people to connect with God, to support each other, and to heal the world. And all the rabbis in all the academies in the world could not generate a tiny fraction of this holiness without the understanding, partnership, and guidance of "Jews in the pews."

As they remind us in seminary, as often as possible: Nine rabbis can't make a minyan, but one ditch-digger can.

In a time all manner of Jewish leadership – rabbis, cantors, teachers, congregational lay leaders – are trying to figure out the right way forward in uncharted territory, it is your voice that is needed most. In the coming weeks, you are going to be getting a number of requests to fill out surveys online:

- A survey on your opinions about synagogue re-opening and personal High Holy Days attendance plans
- A "Getting to Know You" survey from your new Rabbi (hey, y'all!)...because we can't schmooze at Kiddush for now
- A survey on your impressions of some new things we want to try for our Shabbat services in July (more on that coming soon)

I know there's such a thing as "survey fatigue." And you may be wondering, "When I fill out these surveys, I don't know what is done with that information. Will I find out the results, and does my participation really matter?"

Because it's not safe right now to gather information from informal gatherings and parking lot conversations (where the most important and candid information is often shared), these surveys are the best tools we have at this moment to understand the needs, desires, intentions and opinions of the people in the PJTC family. So while

Board Report

The PJTC Board of Directors met on June 22 via Zoom and passed the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Budget. The budget does include a projected deficit, although the amount may fluctuate based on COVID-19 variables. The Payroll Protection Program forgivable loan PJTC received will assist in mitigating a portion of the projected deficit. The board earmarked funding for a position focused on congregational engagement in lieu of filling the vacant development director role. The part-time role will be focused on connecting people, welcoming people and creating programs around shared passions.

The board also voted to create a new restricted fund to maintain Cindy's Playground, the play area adjacent to the PJTC parking lot. The maintenance fund was previously held by Weizmann Day School, which closed permanently in June. The Bernath family – whose daughter the playground is named for – will provide an additional donation to the existing money housed in the fund.

The board also heard the new protocols for the PJTC calendar reservation process to ensure the process is fair to all members, affiliates, committees and groups. The protocols differentiate and establish priorities between special events – such as b'nai mitzvahs – and regular events such as meetings. Anyone wishing to schedule an event must submit an e-mail to Executive Director Beryl Strauss.

Social Justice Committee

The days and weeks have become an undifferentiated flood of overwhelming crises. The Social Justice Committee is responding to some of the conflicts roiling our lives. Yet things are happening so fast that everything takes on the loud hue of an emergency, and we no longer have ample response time--nor do we have the comforts of physical contact that are so important to the strength of our community. It takes a minyan, if not a village, to do some things right, and Zoom is not an adequate replacement for the action and interaction that we need.

But Zoom we have. I am writing this article early in June, and at this time the Social Justice Committee is working with PJTC Clergy and Staff to produce three late June Zoom town halls to begin community conversations about the issues raised by Black Lives Matter. These interactive sessions are designed to respond to three questions: "How Do We Make Sense of What's Happening in the Streets?" "How Did We Get to this Place?" And "Is There a Path Forward for Us as Individuals and a Congregation?" We hope you join in and add your voice to these important gatherings.

A second Zoom program includes a movie premiere and a culminating on-line panel. Check your email from PJTC about these events. From July 4-July 11, PJTC members and friends can stream a new documentary, "John Lewis: Good Trouble." Thanks to PJTC film guru Gail Gendler, Magnolia Pictures will provide congregants and friends the option to view this

vital documentary. There is a \$7 fee per household, and it can be viewed multiple times between July 4 and July 11.

Then, on Sunday, July 12 from 4-5:30 p.m. our SJC Zoom panel discussion of John Lewis' lifelong commitment to social justice and civil rights will be moderated by a founding member of PJTC's Social Justice Committee, Professor Peter Dreier, who has published widely on John Lewis and the Jewish community. Panelists will include the film's director Dawn Porter, activist Heather Booth, and others. The event is free but prior registration is required for security.

Finally, keep an ear out for a friendly phone call from an SJC member reaching out to talk with you about voter registration and casting your ballots on November 3rd. This will be our opening round of calls as we seek to be a synagogue resource to achieve 100% registration and voting. The Temple has endorsed this effort and our Temple leadership will be alerting the congregation to this initiative. SJC members are looking forward to this opportunity to deepen the personal ties that help make PJTC such an inspiring center for anchoring our lives in Jewish faith and values.
