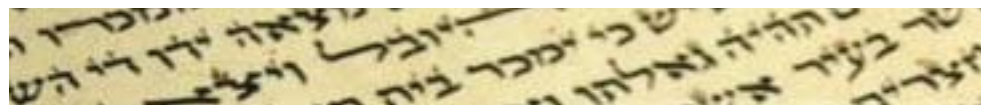

Board Report

The board met on June 24, 2019. They approved the proposed 2019-2020 budget presented by Cathy Krasner, chair of the budget committee. The board approved entering into contract negotiations with Rabbi John Carrier to serve as the interim rabbi beginning July 1. They also approved the installation of a camera in the synagogue with 360-degree live-streaming capabilities; hiring Netzel Grigsby and Associates to conduct a pre-capital campaign study that will coincide with the centennial celebration; using the remaining funds in the Madeline Mark fund to create a native plants memorial garden and establishing a Roz Scherr Memorial Fund that will primarily fund the annual Israeli Scouts visit.

Crowning the Torah with Flowers

In Pasadena, home of the Rose Parade, there's an ongoing flower tradition that does not involve floats or football, but does involve a Torah. Adding their own kind of floral procession for Shavuot, the Pasadena Jewish Temple and Center (PJTC), has been practicing a handed-down custom of making a crown of flowers to place atop their Torahs, since the 1990s.

This year, a group of PJTC congregants, led by temple member Kathy Kobayashi, got together in another member's backyard on the Friday afternoon before the holiday to make the crowns. "It's such a beautiful tradition," said Kobayashi.

During Shavuot, which at times has been known more as an agricultural holiday, it's customary to spruce things up around the home and synagogue with greens and flowers, even branches.

Around 35 years ago, before Kobayashi became a Jew, while reading about Judaism, she found a reference to the flower Torah crown tradition in the "Jewish Catalog" that stuck with her. Making a crown of sweet-smelling flowers and branches to place over the Torah can be seen as an outgrowth of the holiday's green traditions, reasoned the "Jewish Catalog." The custom also seemed inspired, in part, by an interpretation from the Mishnah which says that Israel stood on grass when they received the Torah.

When Kobayashi asked others about the flower crowns, no one knew, and it puzzled her. That was until she heard a chance remark from her friend, long-time temple member, Ilona Fuchs.

Ilona was married to Morton Fuchs, the synagogue's longtime gabbai. "They were both Hungarians from Tokaj. She was a survivor of Auschwitz, and he was a survivor of forced labor camps," said Kobayashi. "Something came up in conversation. 'She told me 'back in Tokaj, they had made these flower crowns,' and it just clicked."

"Tokaj was known for its grapes and wines. They would make the frames [for the flower crowns] from the grapevines, and then you attach the flowers," she explained. "Could you teach us?" Kobayashi remembers asking. "All you need to do is provide the flowers," Ilona responded. "She was delighted that people were interested in reviving this tradition," said Kobayashi.

Ilona had learned the craft from her mother, and her mother from her mother, said Kobayashi. But Ilona had not made a crown in 40 years. They had made the crowns until the family was taken to Auschwitz. When they arrived, it was Shavuot.

Some were told to go one way, some, the other, said Kobayashi. "She never saw her parents again."

The Fuchs came to Pasadena and PJTC in the late 1950s, after the failed Hungarian Revolution. To begin the revival of the flower Torah crown tradition in Pasadena, Kobayashi and her friend Catherine Lefkowitz, went to the downtown flower market. For frames, the Fuchs had grape vines growing in their back yard, and Morton knew how to fashion the wood from them into crown-like shapes.

"When we go to the flower market to get the flowers, it's a great time of year to go, everything's blooming," said Kobayashi who grew up on a Texas truck farm with parents who loved flowers. Over the years, they have found that carnations, small roses, statice and baby's breath work best. After the crowns are completed, they are stored in a refrigerator, and on the morning of Shavuot, are placed on top of two of the temple's Torahs.

Like the vines from which the crowns are formed, the tradition is spreading. A nearby synagogue, Temple Sinai of Glendale, has also been making the crowns from the late 1990s. "We make them together. Two crowns for each congregation," said Kobayashi. Additionally, there's a congregation, Kehillah Synagogue in Chapel Hill, North Carolina where the Fuchs' son

Henry is a member, that also makes the crowns.

"Around ten years ago, Ilona couldn't live in her home any more, so she moved to assisted living near her son." While living there, she died at age 98 in 2016 (Morton had died in 2000), she taught the congregation how to make the crowns.

"Passing on this tradition was so important to Ilona. I feel such a connection," said Kobayashi. "Teaching it was such joy."

100 Years Ago

If Jews in Pasadena wanted their son to have a Bar Mitzvah before 1923, when a synagogue was built and a rabbi was hired, what did they do? Isadore and Helena Goldman decided in 1919 to have their son's Bar Mitzvah at Temple B'nai B'rith (now the Wilshire Boulevard Temple) in downtown Los Angeles. David's Bar Mitzvah was not just community recognition of him as an adult, it was also the first Bar Mitzvah at Temple B'nai B'rith. Though Temple B'nai B'rith was established in 1862, it adhered to the Reform Movement, which had discarded a number of traditional practices, including Bar Mitzvahs. Remembering how important it was for himself, Rabbi Edgar F. Magnin revived the tradition, with 13-year-old David Goldman from Pasadena being the pioneer at Los Angeles area's oldest synagogue.
