Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation

Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation is an approach to supporting caregivers and parents to ensure they are equipped with the knowledge and skills needed to promote healthy social and emotional development. Young children often face other variables that interfere with the development of skills and display atypical behaviors that may indicate additional care needs to get children back on track developmentally. Examples that prompt requests for referrals include:

- Developmental challenges/attention/following directions
- Emotional regulation/behavior modification
- Sensory integration/processing
- Routines/schedules



Certified Breastfeeding Friendly Family Child Care Homes support nursing mothers by being knowledgeable about breastfeeding, breastmilk preparation, and storage. They welcome breastfeeding mothers to nurse on-site and know when and how to refer to lactation professionals if mothers are having trouble with breastfeeding. By attending this training, you will:

- Become competent in supporting nursing families.

- Learn about the benefits of breastfeeding and child care best practices for supporting nursing mothers.

- Complete a self-assessment and action plan to become a Certified Breastfeeding Friendly Family Child Care Home.

- Be advertised on the Northern Colorado Breastfeeding Coalition website (pending certification).

- Be promoted on social media as a Breastfeeding Friendly Family Child Care Home (pending certification).

- Receive a framed Breastfeeding Friendly Family Child Care Home certificate and window cling to proudly display in your home (pending certification).

- Be eligible for 2 Colorado Shines points.
