

This truck and trailer unit arrives at pre-registered schools and children progress through interactive Seed Survivor stations.

Seed Survivor is a **free**, **curriculum-based learning experience** that encourages children in Grades 1 through 6 to master the elements that plants need to grow (**ideal for Grades 3-4**).

The 36-foot trailer is handicap accessible, and includes an entry and exit door. Students spend half the presentation outside the trailer in a guided plant nutrient lesson and exploring outdoor displays, and half the presentation inside the trailer playing related games.

Students explore multi-media and virtual reality games, a sunflower seed planting station, talking walls and much more!

Approximately 30 students can participate in the display at one time and it takes one hour to complete.

Students leave with an understanding that plants need water, light, healthy soil and nutrients to survive.

Collaborating with educators to offer free, curriculum-based school programs that are engaging, factual and fun!



## **Ouick Facts:**

- 1. Seed Survivor was developed in 2005 in Calgary, Alberta, Canada.
- 2. Teachers and industry experts worked together to develop the display's activities, games and content.
- 3. There are 5 interactive stations on water, light, soil, nutrients and growth.
- 4. A Seed Survivor worker is onsite helping students and answering questions.

- 5. One volunteer is required from the school to facilitate the inside gameplay.
- Space requirements: Outdoor 60x30 foot space. No overhanging power lines.
   Entire space must be cleared for parking the unit.
- 7. Schools are welcome to request the display for multiple days.
- 8. Free lesson plans, videos and classroom activities are available online.
