As you know, forestry and forest products make up a large part of this diverse industry and we are writing today asking you to support HB 876 by Senator John Wilkinson.

<u>HB 876 does not mandate the use of wood.</u> It simply provides a statewide level playing field for lumber products used in construction projects, adhering to the State Fire Code. This fire code and the state standards are in place for a reason, and we should recognize and honor these uniform standards for safety and cost-effective construction.

This bill would eliminate ill-conceived local prohibitions so builders and designers could use any approved material for construction if it meets the required building and safety measures set forth by the state. We don't grow concrete and we don't grow steel...we grow trees. A patchwork quilt of ordinances, crafted with little or no debate, that fly in the face of a statewide safety standard is, certainly, not what Georgia needs. You can vote today to fix it by supporting HB 876.
