LETR® (Law Enforcement Torch Run) for Special Olympics is the movement's largest grass-roots fundraiser and public awareness vehicle. Since 1981 thousands of law enforcement officers have carried the "Flame of Hope" through their towns, villages, and cities in 35-counties signifying the unique relationship between the athletes of Special Olympics and the Law Enforcement community.

Nearly 10,000 members of law enforcement and uniformed services, representing more than 200 agencies across New York participate annually in "TORCH RUN". Additionally hundreds of officers participated in POLAR PLUNGE™, Cops on Top at DUNKIN' DONUTS, Applebee's Law & Orders and Special Olympics competitions.



The Law Enforcement Torch Run (LET®) is the largest public awareness vehicle and grass-roots fundraiser for Special Olympics. Known honorably as the "Guardians of the Flame", law enforcement members and Special Olympics athletes carry the "Flame of Hope" into the Opening Ceremony of local, state, national and world competitions. Annually, more than 97,000 dedicated and compassionate law enforcement members carry the "Flame of Hope," symbolizing courage and celebration of diversity uniting communities around the globe.

WHAT WE DO.

The Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics engages law enforcement worldwide championing acceptance and inclusion for people with developmental disabilities, starting first with their own communities. Nearly 10,000 law enforcement officers representing more than 200 agencies across the state participate in the torch run alone... and that's not counting the thousands more that take part in our other signature fundraisers across the state, raising over \$2 million right here in New York in 2017. Since its inception in 1986, New York Law Enforcement Torch Run has raised over \$15 million to support local Special Olympics athletes.
