This past season has been a very active one for the SMT Board. We are happy to say we are finally back on stage with The Fantasticks in May 2022 after having a successful run of SMTY's Dara's Dream in November and our Christmas Cabaret in December. We have a great season lined up for 2022-2023.

During the 2021-2022 season there have been countless virtual meetings where the SMT Board has accomplished the following:

- Continued the refresh of SMT policies and procedures, not just from a procedural point of view but from the perspectives of diversity, equity and inclusion.
- Finalized the transition of our financial systems to an online accounting system and have been using it with better accountability and transparency.
- Did a huge revamp of the workshop at the unit and an update of shop equipment including adding a C & C machine and all new saws which will help greatly in set design/production.
- Began sound proofing the wall between the workshop and rehearsal hall for simultaneous building and rehearsing
- Added air conditioning and internet at the unit.
- Held a very successful fundraising campaign using the new shop equipment.
- Procured a new sponsorship and received matching funds from the Artsvest program.
- Were successful in procuring a number of government grants.
- Created an investment strategy to work in conjunction with our reserves strategy.
- Created a Production Handbook for incoming teams
- And so much more!

SMT will be electing new members to our Board of Directors at this year's Annual General Meeting on August 23rd, 2022.

The next few years are going to be critical as we rebuild from the pandemic both as a group, individual performers, and patrons of live theatre. We are looking for board members who believe in our mission and are willing to be active in their roles. The board meets once a month, and we ask that each member also participate in at least one committee and take on a leadership role.

Members of SMT's Board are responsible for governing and supervising the policies and affairs of SMT, its committees, and carrying out the goals of the organization. If you are currently a Full member of SMT, you have the privilege not only to elect the new Board but also to stand for election. Nominations can also be made the evening of the AGM, as long as the person nominated is present, willing to stand, and the nomination is seconded.

Meetings are usually held once a month, lasting approximately two hours. The actual time involvement varies, depending on the responsibilities of the position.





With lots of new toys there was a need to create a more open space to work.


A large number of the upper platforms have been removed and lots and LOTS of purging was done to make that happen.

Next steps include soundproofing the wall between the workshop and the rehearsal area so building and rehearsing can happen at the same time!



Be a Box Office Volunteer


We're looking for a few more good people to become Box Office Volunteers!

The Theatre Scarborough Box Office provides a vital service for all three theatre companies. Box Office Volunteers sell tickets, answer questions, and facilitate ticket exchanges. This can be done at the theatre when there is a performance on the stage or from the comfort of your own home, where we turn your home phone into the box office phone for a couple hours.

We need some new volunteers who are computer literate and enjoy talking to people, both in person and on the phone. You can choose the frequency with which you volunteer. Some of our folks do the home box office once every two weeks, others more frequently. Some choose only to work at the theatre and others only at home. You set your own flexible schedule.

AUDITIONS – SMT: YOU'RE A GOOD MAN, CHARLIE BROWN



About the show: Charles Schulz's beloved comic comes to life in Clark Gesner's classic musical, You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown. The whole gang is here: bossy Lucy is hopelessly in love with piano prodigy Schroeder who doesn't give her the time of day, perfectionist Sally is still mocking blanket-toting Linus, Snoopy is in the doghouse, and "blockhead," himself, Charlie Brown, is in rare form. Brief vignettes span the months from Valentine's Day to Beethoven Day, from wild optimism to utter despair. In this revised version, with additional music and lyrics by Andrew Lippa and dialogue by Michael Mayer, the sweet, joyful innocence of the Peanuts gang is maintained, but a fresh insouciance and playfulness is revealed. The new script features two new songs, particularly funny dialogue, and new, catchy orchestrations.

Whether you're keen to fly with the Red Baron, moon over the Moonlight Sonata, or just do your best to find "Happiness," You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown is a crowd-pleasing classic.

Some additional or longer rehearsals will be held once the production has moved to the theatre, and these will include:

Sunday, Oct 23, 2022 (Move-In Day), Wednesday, Oct 26, 2022 (Sound Level Set), Sunday, Oct 30, 2022 (Q2Q Technical Rehearsal), Monday, Oct 31, 2022 (Technical Dress Rehearsal), Tuesday, Nov 1, 2022 (Dress Rehearsal) and Wednesday, Nov 2, 2022 (Final Dress Rehearsal)

Audition Requirements:

Please prepare TWO songs from Pop/Jukebox Broadway Musicals keeping in mind the following:

- a. We will only hear one – second song should be a 16-32 bar selection as a back-up choice should we want to hear something different.
- b. We may cut off the songs
- c. We may ask to hear a specific section of the song you've chosen
- d. Songs should showcase your youthful energy
- e. No songs from You're A Good Man, Charlie Brown
- f. We may ask you to stop mid-song, give you a re-direct, and ask you to continue

The sheet music should be:

- i. In the proper key for the pianist
- ii. Hole punched and placed in a binder
- iii. Preferably double sided
- iv. Clearly marked for the accompanist
- v. DO NOT tape together sheets of music or bring single sheets of music

2. Everyone auditioning should prepare a story.

- a. Please tell us a story of a childhood memory.
 - i. You will be given a warning sign at the 2-minute mark
 - ii. You will be stopped at the 2.5 minute mark

Callback Requirements:

Callbacks will be an open and learning experience. We are looking for artists who exhibit the following attributes: Talent, Skill, Discipline and Stamina. ALL actors being considered will be called at the beginning of the day and will slowly be dismissed as we cover the material. As per SMT policies, ALL actors who wish to be cast in the production must attend. Callbacks will consist of:

1. Sides

- Actors will be given sides for the characters for which they are being considered. Participants are not required to memorize the sides, but should be familiar with the material.

2. Music

- Actors will be given sheet music for the characters for which they are being considered. Participants are not required to memorize the music but should be familiar with the material.

3. Dance

- Actors will be asked to take part in a dance call. Please wear appropriate clothing and footwear.

Casting Notes:

All roles are open to consideration regardless of background, ethnicity, or sexual/gender orientation. The characters are children, but we are looking for adults (18+) to fill these roles.

Those best suited for roles will be offered a part in the production based on call-backs. All cast will not be required to dance (there will be stylized movement for all), but each character has different levels of physicality.

There are no Ensemble roles in this production.

Physicality/Intimacy Requirements Legend

C = basic physical contact like shaking hands, arm-in-arm, and partner dancing

K = kissing L = weight bearing, lifting, or being lifted D = a dance role

F = stage fighting S = simulated drug use

I = physical intimacy considered more than kissing

Dance Requirements = Stylized Movement – Light Choreography – Strong Dancer

Vocal Range: Top – F4, Bottom – Bb2; Light Choreography; C, L

A lovable loser. A child possessed of endless determination and hope, but who is ultimately dominated by his insecurities and a permanent case of bad luck.

Sally Brown ♀

Vocal Range: Top – Ab5, Bottom – B3; Light Choreography; C, L

Charlie Brown's younger sister. Sally has a "take it easy" approach to life, preferring to slide by while doing as little work as possible.

Lucy van Pelt ♀

Vocal Range: Top – G3, Bottom – F4; Light Choreography; C, L

A crabby, bossy, selfish girl! She is especially mean to Charlie Brown and her little brother Linus. She is hopelessly in love with Schroeder. Lucy is loud and obnoxious.

Linus van Pelt ♂

Vocal Range: Top – E4, Bottom – Bb2; Light Choreography; C, L, D

Lucy's little brother. He is an intellectual with infinite wisdom beyond his years but has deep rooted insecurities which he quells with his security blanket.

Schroeder ♂

Vocal Range: Top – Ab4, Bottom – Bb2; Light Choreography; C, L

A deeply dedicated lover of classical music and Beethoven. An artist at heart and life.

Snoopy ♀ or ♂

Vocal Range: Top – A3, Bottom – C2; Strong Dancer; C, L, D

Charlie Brown's pet beagle but at times it is not clear who is in charge. Snoopy is blessed with a rich fantasy life and a wide array of emotions.




