


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Our next online town hall is on **January 30 at 7:00 pm**.



SCRO pre-budget submission to the Ontario government: more transit, please!

Toronto's population is projected to grow by 700,000 over the next 30 years. Realistically, at least 175,000 of them will come to Scarborough. Many condo buildings are now in the planning stage to enable this.

How will we all get around? We're not building any more roads. We've got gridlock now and our buses are jammed! The only solution is higher order public transit ... and lots of it.

SCRO's annual pre-budget submission this year to the [Standing Committee on Finance and Economic Affairs](#) was heavily focused on public transit and, in particular, getting our three levels of government to work together, to convert talk into action.

We need our governments to work together on the following:

- ***an extension of the Eglinton East LRT from Kennedy Station***, to University of Toronto Scarborough and then to Malvern, for which planning and design is now at an advanced stage
- ***construction of the Scarborough busway***, to provide an express bus service in place of the decommissioned Scarborough RT until the subway extension opens
- ***construction of the Sheppard Avenue transit extension***, for which community consultations have begun.

Enhanced public transit for Scarborough is an advocacy priority for SCRO at this time: at all three levels of government.


