Info for businesses affected by Tuesday night's unrest

Last evening, shortly after protesters dispersed from a peaceful gathering at City Hall, a large group of young people broke into numerous stores across the city. Some of this occurred in our district.

I want to be clear: Philadelphia Police confirmed that the protesters, who were marching for justice for Eddie Irlizary, had nothing to do with Tuesday night's unrest.

I was in Harrisburg last night when these incidents were taking place. As soon as I heard what was happening, I immediately reached out to the Philadelphia Police, the District Attorney's Office, Mayor's Office, and the Managing Director's Office. I was also able to speak with our partners at Center City District and our neighbors at the Center City Resident's Association, Logan Square Neighborhood Association, and Center City Business Association.

Our neighbors are good people. Our city is a great city. But these incidents cost money, hurt families and incite fear. I want you to know my office is here to help in this time of uncertainty, especially for our business owners.
