Defining Terms as a Starting point for Discussion:

Diversity – The quality of communities having a wide variety of people with different identities, cultures, and experiences.

Equity – Equity is the ideal of providing every person the resources and opportunities necessary to develop their potential despite existing inequality. Since people at any given historical moment start with different levels of resources and power, sometimes you have to treat people differently to give everyone similar chance for success. Equity aims at making the world fairer and more just.

Inclusion – Respecting and welcoming a wide variety of people with different identities, cultures, and experiences.

Justice – Ensuring equal protection under the law, greater participation in creating the law, and fairer and more humane distribution of resources that empower all people, especially groups historically and systemically disempowered.
