In order to allow enough time for LCMS Disaster Response in St Louis to gather and ship class materials, 8/15 (today) is the deadline for event registration on lcms-lert.org. If you are reading this too late to accomplish the registration, please call/text me at 530-520-1458. I will see what I can do to include you in the class roster.

Anyone wishing to be an instrument of God's mercy to the survivors of a disaster and wanting to do so as part of a LERT team must take the Basic LERT training. One such training is being offered just shy of two weeks from now as noted above.

At the center of LERT Volunteer training is one thing: MERCY! God's mercy is the basis for everything we say and do. This training event will equip you to be an effective volunteer should a disaster strike your community or if you wish to help in another community. The training can also be useful for serving during the ordinary days of congregational life. After a brief introduction regarding the goals and theological rationale of LCMS Disaster Response, the LERT volunteer training will address the following:

- *Christian care in times of disaster*
- *A Ministry of Presence*
- *The LERT Program and how it works with other responders*
- *Introduction to Disaster Response*
- *Service Opportunities after a Disaster*
- *Safety Protocols*
- *LERT teams in ordinary congregational life*
- *Thought starters for LERT team specialization*

A team of trained volunteers helps the survivors address the needs created by the disaster. No matter whether it's an earthquake, lava flow, wildfire, storm or flooding, based on the capacity of those who have been trained, God can use us to show the love demonstrated by our LORD, Jesus, the Christ.

Getting the necessary training and also deploying in response to an event can be accomplished by going to <https://www.lcms-lert.org/>. In order to register for the training one must first register for the use of this site. Even if you are not ready to be trained or deploy, this site can provide you with information concerning



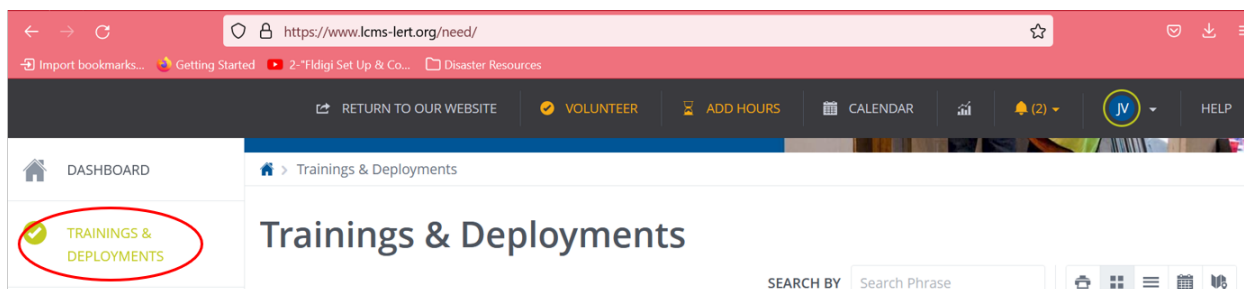
disasters impacting Districts throughout the Synod providing you with information of things to include in your personal prayer life.

How to Register

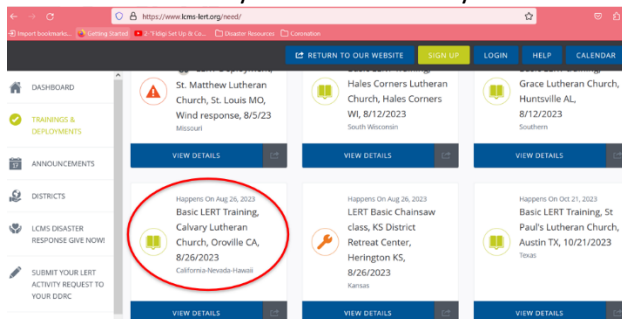
Go to <https://www.lcms-lerc.org/> and click on **SIGN UP** at the upper right of the page. This will enter you into a six step menu through which you can create your account so you will have full access to the site's capabilities. There will also be questions creating a profile of what skills and interests you have so a positive match can be made for using you to help in the best way possible when a disaster deployment occurs. There is also a way for you to become a District "fan" so you will be notified of incidents and the needs those incidents generate. To be deployed requires that you receive LERT training.

Signing Up for a Training or Deployment

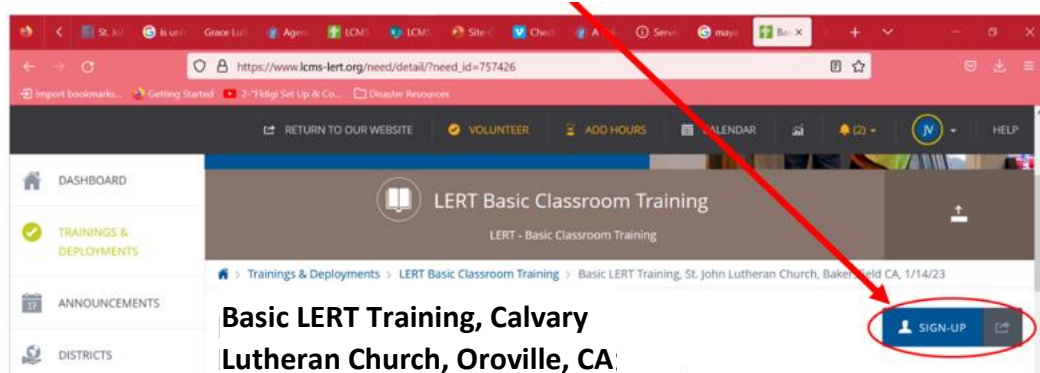
Once logged in, click on "Trainings & Deployments" on the left side of the page:



This will bring up a screen similar to the following. Among the events which have been scheduled is the one taking place at Calvary 8/26. This same screen will also indicate any active deployments which have been scheduled. If you wish to make yourself available to another District, you can do so by clicking on



the "View Details" button for the deployment of your choice and following the resulting menu. The resulting window will look like the one below and by clicking on the "Sign Up" button you can indicate you are available for that deployment. Fill in the various fields on the page including your emergency contact information.



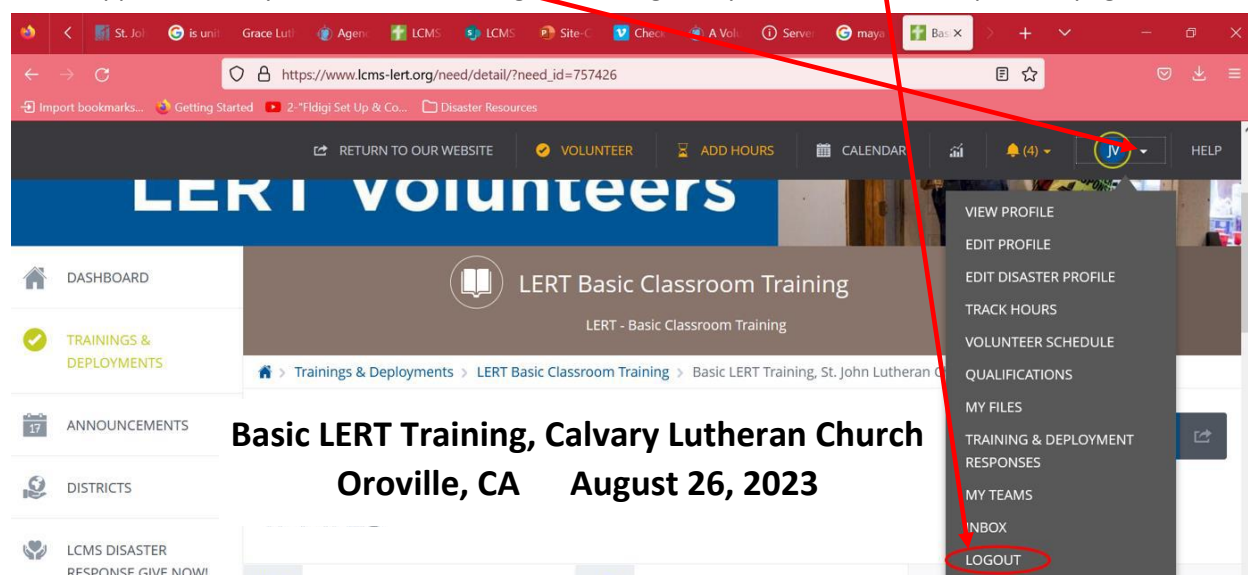
Click on the [SUBMIT TRAINING & DEPLOYMENT RESPONSE](#) button at the bottom of the page to submit your information. The following pop up will appear and an acknowledgement Email will be sent to the Email box you have registered during the account sign up procedure.

Other Site Features

- Disaster announcements posted by various Districts
- A menu page which will take you to whichever District you choose to learn more about the disaster activity taking place in that area
- A quick link through which to request disaster assistance from your DDRC
- A calendar with active links for you to learn more of what various Districts have schedule on a given day



If you are finished, you can now log out of the system by clicking on “log out” using the drop down menu which appears when you click on the triangle to the right of your initials at the top of the page.
