Berthe gave this week's inspiration of different famous people's view on fear.

Speaker

- Presentation of an International Grant of \$1500 for "Teaching Oaxacan Artesanos How to survive in Time of Covid." To help create a pilot project to help artisans on how to market themselves with minimal tourism due to the pandemic.
- Jacqueline Guttman spoke about Over-arching Strategic Planning Goals. Here are some of the highlights:
 - **Membership** – Increase and sustain our membership. Without membership, we have no future. People have to feel that they are connected with the group. We need to connect to a younger audience. What do we have to offer or something of value? Our group has 35 to 40 core members versus the 70 that we have the books.
 - **Service** - Which service projects should we get involved with? This can be local or international activities.
 - **Operations** – How we run the club. This includes technology, committees, speakers and events.
 - **Youth Involvement** – We want to play a significant role in the youth in the community. This could include: Little League, Interact, a Soccer Team, The Zone at the high school, mentoring at the high school and Jr. Police Academy. We should ramp up so when we are post-Covid, we will be able to go forward.

- Education about Rotary – People need to know more about the different aspects of Rotary so they can appreciate the group.
- Fundraising – How to fundraise to help cover the expenses of the different projects that we are looking into.
- Signature Project – The president has picked a project to be worked on during their year. Lisa mentioned that a committee is working on a Teen Peace Program. Charlotte mentioned that some clubs have signature projects that last many years. Jackie wants to look into a racial justice project as her signature project. The Community Chest has a project that focuses on racial justice.

The bolded items were the items the group wants to focus on. The other items were discussion points.
