When Rotary International Added “Environment” as an area of Rotary focus, our club, led by Dave Maron organized the April McKay Park cleanup to celebrate Earth Day. Our signature project, *Teens for Peace* culminates in the dedication of the Peace Pole on Monday June 7th at 6 PM at Veteran’s Park. The Dictionary Project is underway, soon to have its first in person activity at Moriah school distributing the dictionaries to the third graders. On June 15th we are dedicating a bench with a plaque at the Englewood Boat Basin to honor George

Milne On June 29th we will hold our Installation of Officers at 6 PM at the home of Florence Marchi. Our attendance was via virtual participation, though we did not see several members who chose not to log on. Throughout the year we had speakers and guests from around the Country and world.

Mitch reported on two amendments to the By-Laws.

Amend Article VIII Section 1 to add the following new Standing Committee:

Finance Committee: This Committee shall be responsible to (a) recommend to the Board policies for financial management of the Club; (b) review, question and approve the Club's proposed budget for submission to the Board; (c) and, at least quarterly, during the year, audit the financial performance of the Club.

Upon a motion from Janet and second from Jim the proposed amendment carried without dissent.

One third of our members have paid their dues. The Gala thus far has grossed \$12,500 with a few more checks coming in today to be recorded. Happy Dollars are \$10,500 for the year. Total giving for the year is \$19K with 4K of that going to international projects.

We received a District grant of \$2,000 towards the \$3,000 cost of the Teens for Peace and Peace Pole Project. Earlier this year we received \$1,800 from the District for food insecurity due to COVID, and \$750 from NVE Bank for our Earth Day cleanup sponsorship.
