Sunday Activities for Children and Youth

While children of all ages are *always* welcome in our worship services, during our 10:00am service, we offer:

Nursery Care for infants and toddlers from 9:45 – 12noon.

Children's Chapel for children ages PreK through Grade 3.

We begin gathering at 9:45am and the special child-friendly chapel begins at 10am. The children are escorted upstairs in time to join their families in the sanctuary during the Exchange of the Peace. The Nursery and Children's Chapel are located on the lower level. Please ask an usher for directions!
