Sunday Activities for Children and Youth

While children of all ages are *always* welcome in our worship services, during our 10:00am service, we offer:

Nursery Care for infants and toddlers from 9:45 – 12:15.

Children's Chapel for children ages PreK through Grade 3.

We begin gathering at 9:45am and the special child-friendly chapel begins at 10am. The children are escorted upstairs in time to join their families in the sanctuary during the Exchange of the Peace. 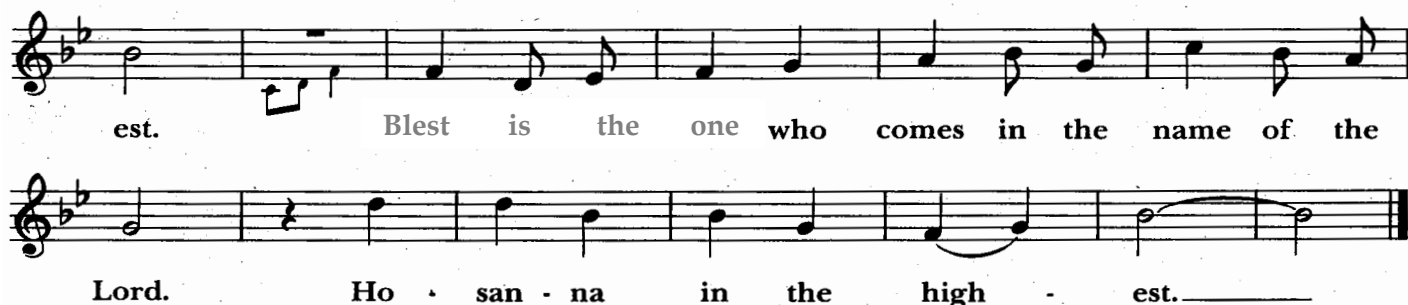


