The Gospel

Matthew 1:18-25

Gospeler The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

"Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel,"

which means, "God is with us." When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus.

The Great Thanksgiving

Feasting on the Word, Eucharistic Prayer for Advent

Presider The Lord be with you.

People **And also with you.**

Presider Lift up your hearts.

People **We lift them to the Lord.**

It is right and a good and joyful thing always and everywhere to give thanks to you,
Almighty God, creator of heaven and earth. You call all people to follow your paths of justice
and peace, beating their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks. In the
light of your holy Word, we look for the day when nation shall not lift up sword against
nation, or learn war anymore.

Therefore, with the entire company of heaven, and with your people on earth who live in this
hope, we praise you and join in the never-ending hymn:

Sanctus and Benedictus

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might

Heaven and earth are full of your glory

Hosanna in the highest!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.

Holy are you and blessed is Jesus your child, for he is Immanuel, God with us. Fulfilling the expectations of the prophets, he healed the blind and the lame, cleansed the lepers, opened the ears of the deaf, raised the dead, and brought good news to the poor. Through his life, death, and resurrection you manifest your new covenant with humankind, and through the church of his disciples you give testimony to the power of your salvation for the world.

For on the night before he died, Jesus was at table with his friends. He gave thanks to you, broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying: take, eat, this is my body given for you.

Do this to remember me.

After supper, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying drink this all of you, for this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Do this to remember me.

Therefore in remembrance of all your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we give ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a living sacrifice in union with Christ's offering for the world as we declare:

Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

Send your Holy Spirit upon us, gathered here out of love for you, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Let the bread we break be a true fellowship in the body of Christ. Let the cup we share be a true participation in the new covenant. By your Spirit empower us to be Christ for the world, serving in his name.

Through your son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, almighty God, now and forever. **Amen**

The Breaking of the Bread

The Presider breaks the bread.

Presider We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

People **We who are many are one body, for we all share one bread.**

Presider The Gifts of God for the People of God, holy food for holy people.

All are welcome to receive communion at Christ Church!

At this service we gather in a circle around the altar and pass the bread and wine to one another. When you give the bread to your neighbor, it is our custom to say "the body of Christ" and you may add "the bread of heaven"; with the wine, "the blood of Christ" and you may add "the cup of salvation." If you forget the words, simply pass the bread and wine with respect & love! You may either sip from the chalice or "intinct" (dip the bread in the wine). If you do not want to partake of the wine, please pass it along to the next person with the accompanying words. Gluten-free wafers are available, alert the priest. If you'd like to join the communion circle but not receive the bread and wine, cross your arms over your chest, and the priest will offer you a blessing instead. When all have received, the Presider will say "Go in Peace," and all return to your seats.

*For those at home without the sacrament – **A Prayer for A Spiritual Communion:***

Faithful God, in the wonder of your wisdom and love, you fed your people in the wilderness with the bread of angels, and you sent Jesus to be the bread of life. Although I am not consuming the gifts of bread and wine, I thank you that I have received the sacrament of Christ's presence. By the power of the Holy Spirit, may I embody your desire and be renewed for your service, through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.

Loving God, you have nourished us at the table of life and hope.

Teach us your way of peace, sustain us as we work for justice, and empower us as we proclaim your love to the world, through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.
