

Pastoral Leadership in Congregational Systems

Description: From a congregational systems perspective, pastoral leadership emphasizes the self-differentiation, presence, and position of the leader as much as pastoral expertise.

While pastors attend different seminaries, the course of study is similar. Why it then that some pastors seem better equipped for ministry in the church than others do? The answer can be found in self-differentiation; the ability to know where one stops and another begins.

Well-differentiated pastors are able to lead more effectively in personal and congregational systems because they are less likely to get stuck by whatever appears to be the “crisis of the day.” They understand what issues and responsibilities belong to them and which ones belong to others. They are able to function in such ways that they remain connected to people and systems while not becoming fused with them. This frees them to think differently: to think outside of the box, dream big, discover new visions, and invite others to share in the adventures of ministry.

This three-part workshop will focus on the three systems in which pastors are called to be present; the entire congregation as a system, individual families within the entire church, and the pastor’s own family of origin. Mornings will be lecture and theory while afternoons will be clinical discussion and case study.

Presenter: The leader of this program is the Rev. Dr. Bruce Stevenson, Lead Pastor at Faith United Church of Christ in Center Valley. Rev. Stevenson participated in Dr. Ed Friedman’s Post Graduate Seminar in Family Emotional Process for four years and received is Doctor of Ministry from Palmer Theological Seminary in Renewal of the Church for Mission.
