March Greetings from Dr. Katrina

I've been on a social media disconnect for Lent, so I hadn't heard of nor seen the conversations around our sibling, our child, Nex Benedict. I learned of Nex in a staff meeting and my heart broke into a million pieces. One, this was hitting home because of a young relative of mine in Tennessee who is being bullied because her best friend identifies as someone in the LGBTQIAN2S+ community. After a bullying incident my relative was asked by the school's Principal, "So, are YOU gay?". My breath stopped in hearing this because here was an adult that was clearly not going to be on the side of right and good for these children, the victims. So when I heard about Nex my breath stopped again and my stomach reached the floor.

I became enraged inside because I wondered again where in the world are the adults that will do right and good by these children?! School systems have implemented policies that hold parents accountable for a child's absence from school. There is a mechanism within the legal system by which a parent may be held liable for their child's actions when their child breaks a law. I question how the situation would change if we advocated for parents of bullies to be held accountable. The child has to get it from somewhere. Either a parent is in support of the bullying or through ACEs (Adverse Childhood Experiences - various forms of physical and emotional abuse, neglect, and household dysfunction) they have pushed the child to bully others. As I was holding these things, the wind was knocked out of me again in learning of the bill to law imprisonment of our LGBTQ+ Ghanian siblings that mimics Uganda's law; then hearing of the murder of a transman, Righteous Torrence "TK" Hill (Chevy), a barber in Atlanta, GA, and the shooting of a Gay identified man, John Walter Lay, in a dog park in Tampa, FL, where the evidence in both shows that the violence was motivated by hate. And then there's the new wave of bills targeting libraries that is yet another threat coming for our democracy, atop the over 500+ threats that are already in existence.

I really wanted to write something that gave full celebration to Women's HerStory month, but I'm stuck asking where the adults are; where are the people who truly care about humanity regardless of how one identifies themselves. I am stuck in a non-titled, non-position-holding space where I am fully human first, and I am overwhelmed. I thank you for letting me share my humanness, because at the same time I am holding on to hope. I am hopeful because I know we have committed individuals like you who help us be present; help us be able to stand firmly in justice's and equity's footprints as we guide in creating safe spaces for the LGBTQIAN2S+ community and its family members.

Thinking of you and your commitment to this movement gives me tangible hope during such a time we are facing. I personally thank you for your financial support! It is the only way we can be active advocates in this justice work we do and seek to expand. Romans 12:21 reminds us, "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good". So, in honor of Women's HerStory month, I am asking you to donate to The Coalition so that I may yet guide the vision of this great organization. Yes, our priority is being an example to the world by building a 100% open and affirming safe space, but it's also being frontline advocates for

our LGBTQIAN2S+ siblings and their rights as God's creation in God's image, beautiful and gifted human beings.
