Breakfast Conversation with On Juneteenth author Annette Gordon-Reed

Dear Colleagues:

I am writing on behalf of myself and faculty colleague Dr. Teresa Grettano, director of the First Year Seminar, to invite you to a breakfast conversation on Thursday, October 13, 8:30-9:30am, at Chef von & Mom restaurant at 501 Linden Street, with Pulitzer Prize winner Annette Gordon-Reed, the Carl M. Loeb University Professor at Harvard University and author of On Juneteenth. The book is the University of Scranton's first year read and Dr. Gordon-Reed is the speaker for the Ignatian Values in Action annual lecture on Oct. 12 (see attached flyer). Her full bio is available online.

This conversation will provide an opportunity for university-community discussion about the book, including reflection on themes and topics it raises about the Texas and American story that resonate with the <u>Scranton's Story</u>, <u>Our Nation's Story</u> project's efforts to bring to the fore underrepresented stories in Scranton, including Black, Indigenous and recent immigrant and refugee histories and experiences. Dr. Gordon-Reed will engage in conversation and Q&A.
