All students taking the course for authorization purposes are required to complete a final paper and have it submitted to the instructor no later than April 1st. If a rewrite of the final paper is required, the instructor agrees to read only ONE re-write.

Each student has TWO OPTIONS for the final paper, choose OPTION 1 or OPTION 2.

OPTION 1

Submit your ordination, licensure, or privilege of call paper as required by your local Committee on Ministry.

OPTION 2

History, Theology and Polity Paper (Final Paper)

This paper, in two sections (20 pages total) is intended to provide POC students with their required polity paper. The paper is also the basis for the polity section of an ordination paper for MIDs.

The *first section* of this paper is intended to provide an opportunity for the student to demonstrate his or her knowledge and understanding of the history and theological roots of the United Church of Christ. The student could write an interpretation of the history and theology of the UCC referring to and commenting on key dates, persons, events and documents that illustrate his or her interpretation. Themes such as autonomy and covenant, pietism and enlightenment, ecumenism, and unity amid diversity should be addressed in this paper. In addition, the student may comment on her or his personal theological perspectives as they contrast or concur with the theological roots of the UCC.

The *second section* of this paper should reflect upon the following questions:

- 1. What is the creative tension of covenant and autonomy in the UCC as outlined in the practices of the UCC?
- 2. Describe what lay and ordained ministry share in the practice of ministry in the UCC? Where are there differences?

- 3. There is no hierarchy of authority in the UCC, however there is an interrelationship between the settings of ministry in this denomination. Describe them.
- 4. Reflect on the Ministerial Codes in the UCC and how these guide us/shape us as a denomination.

Proper grammar, punctuation, spelling, etc. will be taken into consideration.
