Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service

Dr. Martin Luther King delivered his "I have a dream" speech on August 28, 1963 at the March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom. The March was meticulously planned to address themes and build support for a movement that hoped to last for years: a movement to create equal rights for African Americans. What most Americans remember most about the March was King's iconic "I have a dream speech," but the "dream" passage itself wasn't new. Doctor King had been calling on his "dream" for a more compassionate future years prior to the March on Washington. That decades later we identify Doctor King's "dream" as his enduring legacy speaks not just to the hope he could inspire in a brilliant moment, but his tireless and enduring commitment to a single vision.

January 20th is Martin Luther King Jr. Day, and with it, the 25th National Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service. As emergency managers, we are uniquely empowered to affect change in places we care about every day. The FEMA mission is to help people before, during, and after disasters. By embracing the friendship of our neighbors and striving to make our cities, towns, schools, parks, places of worship, and places of work safe and secure, we are building a community according to our visions.

In this month's tips and taglines, we at FEMA Region III hope you will help to honor Doctor King by taking the time to think, plan, and act on a dream you have for your own community. Use the day of service as an opportunity to pursue a big idea, or a small one, that you'd like to see realized. Find a cause that supports your idea and join it. Or, take the first steps towards enacting the change on your own. Recruit allies who share your idea and brainstorm. Organize an event or a fundraiser. Doctor King worked tirelessly to build the world he wanted to live in – but its important to remember that decades of work preceded his "I have a dream" speech, and decades more followed it.

As we begin the new year and the new decade, we encourage you to use this month's tips and taglines to take the first step towards your dream community. The resources here are meant to provide you with a quick guide that makes it easy for you to lead by example. Included are:

Getting Started

- While no two projects will be the same, successful projects will share a few common practices. We encourage you to incorporate the following elements into your service project:
 - Create a team with your friends and neighbors to share the effort.
 - Choose and plan a service project that is important to you.
 - Create a volunteer plan with your team to be active in your community.
 - Set outcome-based goals and track your progress toward those goals.
 - Celebrate your successes together.

Identify Opportunities for Service

- o Educate yourself and your team about your community.
- Check out organizations already working on projects. Many existing service groups have identified community needs and have built the expertise to provide solutions.

Serve

- After you have your team and service project, head out into your community on January 20th in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.
- Be on the lookout for ways to grow your team and contribute to your movement, not only on MLK day, but throughout the year.
