Biography of Dr. Robert Fogal

Bob Fogal is a licensed United Church of Christ minister, an executive coach to nonprofit leaders in person-centered communication, and a part-time faculty member in the Department of Public Service and Administration at Villanova University. He has been a certified practitioner of the Myers Briggs Type Indicator® since 1990, applying the principles of psychological type to his work as a nonprofit executive as well as a pastoral leader.

Bob has held senior positions at Lancaster (PA) Theological Seminary, Otterbein College in Ohio, Ohio Presbyterian Retirement Services, Lutheran Social Services of South Central Pennsylvania, Essentia Health System in Minnesota, Presby Inspired Life (Philadelphia) and Pennsylvania Southeast Conference. He is also former director of The Fund Raising School at the Lilly Family School of Philanthropy at Indiana University. Bob has led seminars and workshops for dozens of religious, professional and community organizations throughout the United States and in South Africa and Israel.

Before entering the field of philanthropic fundraising, Bob was a church music professor at the Protestant Institute for Advanced Theological Studies in Buenos Aires, Argentina, where he also implemented ethnographic field research. He holds the master of sacred music degree from Union Theological Seminary (New York) and a Ph.D. from Indiana University in folklore and ethnomusicology.

Biography of Rev. Ann Graves

Rev. Ann Graves taught public school music and was a church musician for many years before she went to seminary. She has served as the Penn Central Conference educator for the New Century Hymnal and has a deep love of hymnody and their use in worship. For over 10 years, she wrote a monthly music in worship column "The Cantor" for the churches of Penn Central Conference. She lives in State College, and has served a number of congregations as an Intentional Interim Pastor.

Biography of Rev. Heather Kurtz

Rev. Heather N. Kurtz is a native of Ephrata, Pennsylvania and has been ordained for ten years. Educated in the public school in the Ephrata area, she received her Bachelor of Science degree from Defiance College with a dual major in Religious Studies and Christian Education in 1996. She received her Master of Divinity degree from United Theological Seminary in the Twin Cities, Minnesota in 2001. A minister with full standing in the United Church of Christ, Rev. Kurtz has been on three church staffs during her ministry. She is currently the minister of Grace United Church of Christ, in Northampton, Pennsylvania. Rev. Kurtz has been involved in a number of pursuits ranging from youth ministry, interning at the National Office of the United Church of Christ in Cleveland, to overseas ministry in the United Reform Church in England.
