## SHELTON DRUM and the 40th ANNIVERSARY of HEROESCON

**Shelton Drum** was a busy young man: he began buying and selling comics in the early 1970s, started the Charlotte Mini-Con in 1977, and opened his first brick-and-mortar comic shop—the first location of what would become *Heroes Aren't Hard to Find*—in 1980. But another of his signature achievements was the founding of the **Heroes Convention in 1982**, which turns forty this year. Over the decades, HeroesCon has become one of the premiere comics events in the United States, and Shelton has been at the center of it all, hearing the stories, bonding with creators, dealers, and fans, and sometimes navigating the event through controversies and

difficulties, most recently its two-year Covid shutdown. Join Shelton and interviewer Craig Fischer for an in-depth talk about the history (and future!) of HeroesCon, and bring your own questions to ask Shelton too!
