DAY 1 – ROLLA, MO >> MIAMI, OK

The adventure officially kicks off with a full day of classic roadside charm and vintage Americana as you hit the road to celebrate 100 years of Route 66! Along the way, you'll enjoy the Route 66 Neon Park in St. Robert, the Route 66 Museum in Lebanon, and a photo stop at the iconic Munger Moss Motel, a true symbol of mid-century motel culture. By late morning, you'll head west for a favorite roadside stop at Gary's Gay Parita in Ash Grove, a lovingly restored Sinclair station that feels like stepping back in time. Lunch is served at the unique Hangar Kafe in Miller, MO, where you can dine with views of vintage aircraft and maybe even catch a plane taking off! The afternoon is packed with legendary sights: drive by the historic 66 Drive-In Theatre and the art deco Boots Court Motel in Carthage, then cross into Kansas for a photo op at the Route 66 Marker in Galena. Explore either Gearhead Curios or Cars on the Route, both packed with memorabilia and photo opportunities. From there, cruise past the Riverton FFA Route 66 Sculpture, cross the historic Rainbow Bridge in Baxter Springs, and take in several more quick sights including Allen's Conoco Fillin' Station and the charming Dairy King in Commerce, OK. Settle into the Hampton Inn in Miami, Oklahoma before a delicious group dinner at Mia Bella Italian. Cap off your first day in style at the stunning Coleman Theatre for the *Route 66 Revue*, a live performance that brings the spirit of the highway to life—an unforgettable ending to an incredible first day on the road. **LD**

DAY 2 – MIAMI, OK >> CLINTON, OK

Day 2 of your Route 66 Centennial journey continues west, driving through the charming towns of Afton and Vinita. Visit the colorful and whimsical Ed Galloway's Totem Pole Park, home to the world's largest concrete totem pole—a true folk art marvel. Next, roll into Catoosa for one of Route 66's most beloved icons: the smiling Blue Whale, perfect for a fun and memorable photo op. Heading into Tulsa, capture the spirit of the route at the Cyrus Avery Centennial Plaza and the historic Route 66 Bridge over the Arkansas River—the symbolic birthplace of Route 66. At noon, enjoy a flavorful lunch at Pops 66 Soda Ranch in Arcadia, OK, where over 700 sodas line the shelves and the massive soda bottle sculpture out front makes for a perfect group photo. After lunch, take a short walk through the beautifully restored Arcadia Round Barn, a classic roadside stop with rich history. In the afternoon, you'll head through Oklahoma City to Clinton, OK. Check into the La Quinta Inn, then head to a classic Route 66 dining experience at Lucille's Roadhouse—a perfect way to unwind and reflect on another full day of Mother Road magic. **BLD**

DAY 3 – CLINTON, OK >> AMARILLO, TX

Get ready for another unforgettable day celebrating the culture and spirit of Route 66 with photo ops at the Tower Station, U-Drop Inn Café and Magnolia Gas Station in Shamrock, TX. By mid-morning, cross into Texas and celebrate with lunch at the Midpoint Café and Gift Shop in Adrian, Texas—exactly halfway between Chicago and Santa Monica. The afternoon continues with a stop at Cadillac Ranch in Amarillo, where you can grab a spray paint can and leave your mark on this ever-changing art installation of half-buried Cadillacs. Enjoy retail therapy as you explore the antique shops and boutiques along Historic 6th Street in Amarillo, filled with Route 66 charm and treasures. After checking into the Home 2 Suites, the evening wraps up with a hearty dinner at the iconic Big Texan Steak Ranch, where you can enjoy a Texas-sized meal and maybe even cheer on someone brave enough to take the 72 oz. steak challenge! **BLD**

DAY 4 – AMARILLO, TX >> OKLAHOMA CITY, OK

The day kicks off with two iconic roadside attractions – the quirky Leaning Tower of Texas in Groom and the nostalgic Phillips 66 Gas Station in McLean. By midday, you'll arrive in Oklahoma City to explore the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum, where the legends of the Old West come to life. Enjoy a delicious lunch on-site before heading to the somber and powerful Oklahoma City National Memorial. In the afternoon, take in the sights of downtown on a scenic Bricktown Water Taxi ride through the city's lively entertainment district. The evening winds down as you check into your hotel in Bricktown, with the night free to explore, dine, and enjoy Oklahoma City's vibrant nightlife at your own pace. **BL**

DAY 5 – OKLAHOMA CITY, OK >> ROLLA, MO

Your Route 66 adventure continues at the Heart of Route 66 Auto Museum in Sapulpa, OK, where gleaming vintage cars and fascinating exhibits celebrate the golden age of the open road. By noon, it's time to dine at Ollie's Station in Tulsa, a local favorite filled with railroad-themed charm and Route 66 nostalgia. After lunch, visit the Route 66 Historical Village, home to a towering oil derrick and a restored train depot that highlight Tulsa's rich history. The day winds down with a scenic drive back into Missouri as we head home to memories of the days gone by. **BL**
