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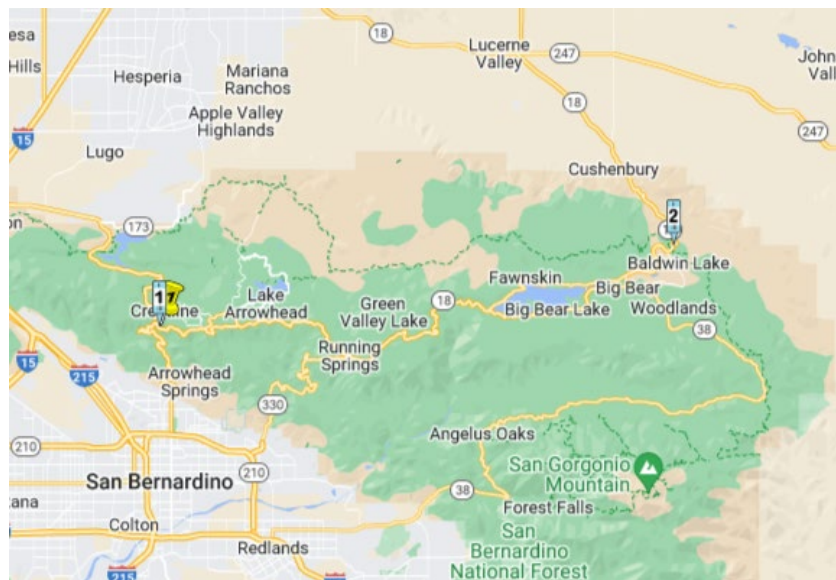

Horizontal Curve Warning Signs Upgrades and Installation SBCO and RIVCO Various Routes

SAN BERNARDINO, CA – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) informs the public that construction contractors continue sign work on various routes. This is part of a \$5.1M safety project to upgrade and install curve warning signs.

Work for the week of July 29 will be located on SR-18 during daytime hours from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Monday through Thursday. Contractor crews will perform work at various locations, requiring flagging for traffic control in both directions along the routes. These will be temporary moving flagging operations to allow work from one location to the next. Work this week will occur near Snow Valley moving north. Closures are dependent on contractor receiving proper materials for each job function. They can be changed or canceled at any time. Weather permitting.



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Drivers, please adhere to posted speed limits and signage informing of closures and roadwork ahead.

This is an active work zone with flagging and potential traffic delays. FLAGGING OPERATIONS MAY REQUIRE UP TO 25 MINUTE WAIT TIMES to allow for through traffic to pass. PLAN AHEAD and drive safely being mindful of closures and alternate routes.

Semi-trucks and oversized vehicles: To avoid traffic delays consider using alternate routes to access surrounding communities. Drive safely being mindful of no truck signage on alternate routes, clearance, and low width zones.
