






Make a Splash With Math!

First Grade Summer Math Program At Bassett Elementary

Welcome to the First Grade 2017 Summer Math Program at Bassett! As you dive into the Summer Reading Program, you can also complete our Summer Math Program by exploring eight different creatures that can be found living in the ocean. To complete the math program, you need to do 10 minutes of math 3 times a week for 8 weeks of the summer. As you complete each 10 minutes of math, make a check-mark in the table below. At the end of the week, color in the ocean creature for that week. When you have colored in all eight ocean creatures, you have completed the program.

As a kindergartener, your child learned addition and subtraction facts from 0-5. Please reinforce those facts! Comfortable with those facts? Move on to some of the goals for students by the end of first grade:

BY THE END OF FIRST GRADE, YOUR STUDENT SHOULD BE ABLE TO:

- Identify and write numbers up to 120 correctly
- Know addition and subtraction facts from 1-10. Practice, practice, practice!! During first grade, your child will take timed tests with 20 addition or subtraction problems that the children will need to complete in 1 minute! (Already know them? Work on addition and subtraction facts from 1-18)
- Understand fact families (i.e. $2+8=10$, $8+2=10$, $10-2=8$, and $10-8=2$)
- Add 3 numbers to get to 10 ($2+3+5=10$, $1+6+3=10$, etc.)
