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#### **January–March 2012: Argentinean Patagonia**

- 14, 22 January: Buenos Aires
- 24, 26, 28, 29, 31 January; 2 February: Atlantic Coast including Peninsula Valdéz / Geopark Bryn Gwyn / Paleontology Museum Egidio Feruglio in Trelew / Punta Tombo penguin colony / Petrified forest near Sarmiento / Santa Cruz and Monte León National Park
- 5, 7 February: Glaciers on the eastern edge of the Andes around El Calafate and Perito Moreno glacier
- 9, 12 February: The “end of the world”—the southern end of Tierra del Fuego around Ushuaia including Tierra del Fuego national park
- 15, 18, 20 February: The eastern flank of the Andes—glaciers and mountains (e.g., Cerros Torre and Fitzroy) around El Chaltén
- 24 February: farther north along the eastern flank of the Andes including the famous Route 40, Cueva de las Manos (Cave of the Hands)
- 29 February: the Argentinean lake district including area around Bariloche and San Martín de los Andes
- 6, 11 March; 3 April: return to Buenos Aires; Patagonia’s geologic history

#### **September–November 2015: Portugal, southern Spain (Andalusia), and northern Morocco**

- 5, 18, 23, 25, 26 September: Lisbon and Sintra in Portugal
- 28 September: Faro on the south coast of Portugal, Jerez de la Frontera and Cádiz in southwestern Spain
- 1 October: Tarifa in southernmost Spain
- 4, 11 October: Fez, Tangier, and Asilah in Morocco
- 11 October: Gibraltar, piece of Great Britain in Spain
- 16, 18 October: Ronda and surrounding “white towns” including Grazalema, Zahara de la Sierra, and Sentenil de las Bodegas (southern Spain)
- 23, 26 October: Granada and the Alhambra (southern Spain)
- 27 October: Zuheros, small town between Granada and Córdoba
- 1 November: Córdoba
- 3 November: Sierra de Aracena and small villages such as Aracena, Linares de la Sierra, and Corteconcepción
- 7, 16 November: Seville and follow up

**August 2016: Mount McLoughlin in southwestern Oregon**

**October 2016: Southern France, from Bordeaux to Toulouse**

- 17, 18 October: Bordeaux and the wine regions of Médoc and Saint Emilion
- 22 October: biking in the Entre-Deux-Mars region from Bordeaux to Toulouse
- 24 October: Pyla dune on Arcachon Bay, coast west of Bordeaux

**July 2017: Lava Beds National Monument, northeastern California**

**September 2017: Northwestern Argentina, eastern edge of the Andes**

- 11, 16 September: La Quebrada de Humahuaca and small towns of Tilcara (hiking with llamas), Iruya (remote mountains), Salina Grande (salt flats)
- 16, 19 September: Ischigualasto National Park (fossil “heaven”), Talampaya National Park (red rock formations), Leoncita National Park (land sailing)
- 25 September: San Juan Argentina (earthquake capital)
- 25 September: Córdoba city

**October 2017: Cascade-Siskiyou National Monument, southwestern Oregon**

**May 2018: Kilauea volcano in Hawai’i**

**June 2018: Mount St. Helens volcano in southern Washington**

**July 2018: Craters of the Moon National Monument in Idaho**

**October 2018: Dinosaur National Monument in Utah and Colorado**

**December 2018: Guanajuato Mexico (silver mines)**

**September 2019: Hiking the Haute Route in the Swiss Alps; northern Italy**

- 18 September: Chamonix and western end of the Haute Route
- 22 September: Central section of the Haute Route
- 27 September: Eastern end of the Haute Route and Zermatt
- 1 October: Carrara Italy (marble quarry)
- 8 October: Cinque Terre (five towns on the northwestern coast of Italy)

**TO BE ADDED April–May 2020: SW Oregon**

- 20 April: The Rogue Valley region in SW Oregon: displaying 300 million years of geologic time
