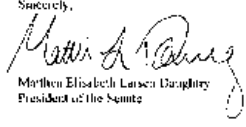

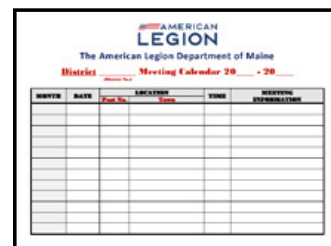

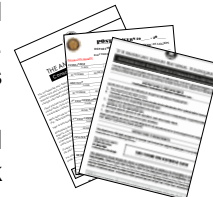

Important Info

PROCESS MEMBERSHIP – ONLINE TRANSMITTAL

Online membership processing is available for posts, squadrons, departments and detachments. If you submit a transmittal online, do not send cards or money to your department.

Important information to know about online membership processing.

- Payment information is entered when finalizing the first transmittal and stored for future batches. A second transmittal cannot be finalized until the first completes. This hold is to ensure payment information is stored correctly and to prevent multiple declines. Attempting to finalize a transmittal prior to the first one completing will result in an error message. This hold is activated each time new bank information is entered.
- Open batches are to be finalized within 14 days. Reminders to submit are emailed to adjutants and are deleted if no action is taken. All members in the transmittal will have to be re-entered in a new batch.
- Pending transmittals in process must complete before any adjustments can be made. Renewing a member for the incorrect membership year or any other adjustments are to be reported to your department.
- Current processing time is an average of 10 days. Member records are updated when the batch is posted. Review transmittal history to view batch status.
- There is a \$10,000 batch limit. Amounts higher than that should be broken down to separate transmittals that meet the limit.
- Stored bank information can be updated when finalizing a transmittal. On the payment window, select "Update Account Information".
- Declined batches can be resubmitted. Contact myLegion support for questions regarding declined batches.

Legion FAQs

Q: What are the eligibility dates for membership in The American Legion?

A: Thanks to the LEGION Act (Let Everyone Get Involved in Opportunities for National Service Act) signed into law on July 30, 2019, the current eligibility period is Dec. 7, 1941, to the present, and includes the current war campaigns.

Previously, there were seven declared war periods. Now there are two: the current war period dating back to World War II and another covering World War I.

No other restrictions to American Legion membership have changed.

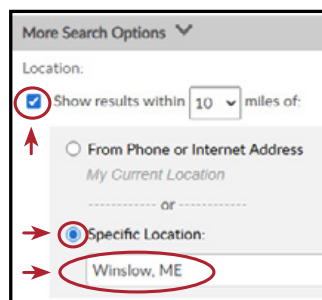
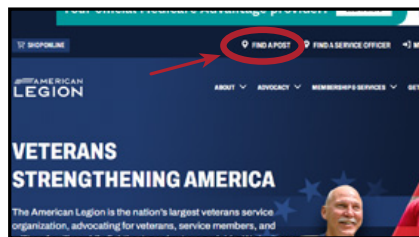

The Old American Legion Post

Part Three: The Four Pillars

"No, no, no. Parade and uniforms were important, but The American Legion isn't all about the parades or uniforms. It was, and is, all about the veterans and supporting our way of life as Americans. The parades showed the public the Legion, but there was a lot that went on behind the scenes."

"Like what?"

"Look here," he handed me a pamphlet entitled The Four Pillars.

"What do they mean by pillars?"

"Pillars are the large stone structures that hold up the roof. In this case, it means the beliefs and the missions of The American Legion."

"Oh."

I see the first one is, "Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation. What is that all about?"

"Keep reading," the man urged.

I read out loud, slowly trying to understand it all.

For more than 90 years, The American Legion has acted as the nation's leading advocate for proper health care, economic opportunity and legal benefits for U.S. military veterans. The Legion was instrumental in the creation of the Veterans Administration in 1930, and an ardent supporter of its elevation to cabinet status when it became the Department of Veterans Affairs in 1989. American Legion Post #20 hosts event aimed at reducing rate of veteran suicide

American Legion Post # 20 Brunswick Maine will host a BE THE ONE TRAINING, which is aimed at reducing the number of veterans lost to suicide. The American Legion is leading a nationwide effort — Be the One— to eliminate the stigma related to mental health treatment, and in turn, lower the number of veterans who die by suicide every day.

The number of veterans who die by suicide every day is estimated at between 17 and 22. The American Legion has elevated Be the One to be its primary mission, empowering veterans, servicemembers, their family members and civilians to act appropriately when a veteran may be at risk. This event intends to bring more awareness to the problem while providing resources to those who may be able to help save the life of a veteran.
