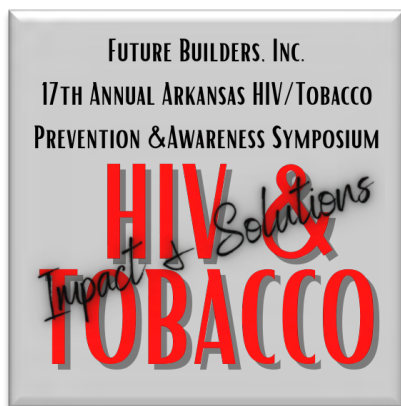

Under her leadership at Future Builders, Inc., many programs were implemented that touched the lives of thousands across Arkansas. She started the Annual Arkansas HIV/Tobacco Prevention and Awareness Symposium, and this year marks the 17th year of this educational event. Mrs. Conley was instrumental in writing, designing, and implementing the National AmeriCorps Demonstration Model, an intergenerational service concept involving three states in the Lower Delta areas: Arkansas, Louisiana, and Mississippi. This demonstration model is now a nationwide program known to many as AmeriCorps.

Brandynicole Brooks-Harris, PhD, LICSW



Brandynicole Brooks is a clinical social worker with seventeen years of experience in providing trauma-informed crisis intervention, service coordination, and therapeutic support to various populations. Since 2014, Dr. Brooks has utilized the skills garnered from the practice of social work to educate, empower, and develop professionals and students with a specific focus on diversity, equity and inclusion, trauma-informed care, addressing secondary traumatic stress, and leadership development and support. Her book, *Black Single Mothers and the Child Welfare System: A Guide for Social Workers on Addressing Oppression*, was published by Routledge Publishers in December 2015. Dr. Brooks also practices as a full spectrum doula and a perinatal mental health specialist and holds certification as a Certified Clinical Trauma Specialist and a Certified Compassion Fatigue Professional.

Katherine Donald has served as the Executive Director for the Coalition for a Tobacco-Free Arkansas for more than nineteen (19) years. She has been instrumental in assisting in the passage of several statewide and local tobacco control laws and numerous voluntary policies that help to protect the public from exposure to secondhand smoke in places where they live, work, learn, worship, and play. For the past thirty plus years, Katherine has worked professionally for both the private and public sectors in fields affecting adolescent development, family enrichment, public health, and community development. She is a certified trainer and

consultant for a national organization that focuses on family enrichment and parental empowerment issues. Katherine has conducted trainings and supervised iterant programs from California to Massachusetts and much of the Mid-west. Additionally, she has managed and administered a multiplicity of programs at the local level. Katherine received her first degree from Philander Smith College in Little Rock, Arkansas, and continued her education through graduate studies in Rehabilitation Education at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock.

Eddie Wiley, MPH



For 16 years, Eddie Wiley has worked across the Southern United States to combat HIV stigma and health disparities, particularly within communities of color. He has facilitated and received numerous trainings around health literacy, stigma reduction, cultural humility, and trauma-informed approaches. As a presenter at local and national conferences, Eddie has been able to speak of his experiences as a person living with HIV in addition to being an HIV service provider. Eddie began his career as a 3MV facilitator. Since then, he founded and serves as the Principle Consultant for Maverick Consulting. As a consultant, he has

developed training curriculum, managed the HIV.gov social media channels, and facilitated the HIV/AIDS Bureau's Community of Practice. Eddie received his Master of Public Health in Social and Behavioral Sciences from the University of Memphis in 2017 and a B.A. in English and Communications from Philander Smith College in 2010.

Charles Bedell, MD, MPH



Dr. Charles T. Bedell was born in Monrovia, Liberia, West Africa. He is the *Associate Branch Chief of the* Arkansas Department of Health, Infectious Diseases Branch. He was the HIV Services (Ryan White Program Part B and AIDS Drugs Assistance Program, ADAP) Manager (January 2016 – August 2018).
