8:20 - 8:30 Welcome and Introductions

8:30 – 10:10 **Media Relations** – Karlyn Tilley, Jefferson County Sheriff's Office PIO. How to help Building Departments effectively deal with the media and related backlash that come with natural disasters and the rebuilding process. Highlighting the little victories and how to build on that momentum.

10:10 – 10:20 Break

10:20 - Noon **Intro Into Mass Timber 101** – David Tyree, PE, American Wood Council. This short presentation will provide an overview of mass timber, which includes any product currently permitted for use in Type IV (heavy timber) construction, such as cross-laminated timber (CLT), structural composite lumber (SCL), glue laminated timber (glulam), mechanically laminated decking (aka nail-laminated timber, NLT), and large section sawn timbers. NLT, glulam, SCL, and solid-sawn timbers have been adopted in the International Building Code (IBC) and utilized throughout the world for several decades on a wide variety of buildings. Topics will include what's new in the IBC for mass timber construction, an overview of tall mass timber construction per the 2021 IBC; development of the new Type IV Types of Construction, full-scale testing of CLT, and development of the height and area tables for mass timber construction in accordance with the 2021 IBC.

1:55 – 3:25	Code Compliance for Commercial & Residential ICF Structures – Scott Campbell and Shamim Rashid-Sumar , National Ready Mixed Concrete Association. Insulated concrete forms (ICF) have been in use in North America since the 1960s. First known as “Foam Form,” contemporary ICF combines reinforced concrete with expanded polystyrene (EPS) insulation to create walls that meet or exceed code as it relates to fire and extreme weather events. ICF wall systems have also been used for bearing wall structures ranging from single story to high-rise buildings over 40 stories tall and everything in between. In addition to ICF walls, there are also ICF floor and roof systems.

3:30 – 5:00	Code Compliance for Commercial and Residential ICF structures – The second half of this course will provide an overview of the basics of concrete wall types with an emphasis on Insulated Concrete Forms. The course will review the relevant code requirements, examine the performance characteristics, as well as offer case studies that demonstrate the use of insulated concrete forms in commercial, industrial, residential, and institutional settings. Examine case studies demonstrating ICF performance in the built environment.


