The CHBC is the largest and longest-established advocate for the hydrogen and fuel cell industry in Sacramento. We write today in support of your SB 1350 which would update the definition of renewable electrical generation facilities in California statute, ensuring the state's clean energy policies reflect emerging technologies needed to meet its ambitious climate and energy goals.

Hydrogen and fuel cell technologies are an important part of this transition, providing reliable, zero-emission power generation that can complement intermittent renewable resources while strengthening grid resilience. California has set aggressive targets for decarbonizing its power sector and economy. The policy will also lead to the creation of family sustaining employment opportunities for skilled and trained workers and apprenticeships for those interested in a career in the building and construction trades.
