

The House is expected to consider SB 382 on second consideration on Monday, November 15th. We can expect the House to consider [this amendment](#), which will be offered by Rep. Delozier.

- [Senate Bill 382](#) (Langerholc-R) amends Title 74 (Transportation), in public-private transportation partnerships, for defs., for duties of board and for operation of board; and voiding prior initiatives of Board.
 - **Status:** Passed Senate, 28-19, 2021 – House Transportation, 4/29/2021 – Reported, [16-9](#) (Rep. O’Mara voted with the Republicans), 11/9/2021 – 1st Consideration, 11/9/2021 – Laid on Table, 11/9/2021 – **Removed from Table, 11/10/2021**
 - Increase transparency by requiring PennDOT to publish a detailed analysis prior to the P3 Board’s voting meeting, and mandate PennDOT to distribute a copy of the P3 Board’s resolution, with or without a user fee, within 24 hours.
 - Incorporate public input by creating a new 30-day public comment period prior to the P3 Board meeting.
 - Create checks and balances on the obscure P3 Board by clarifying any P3 project with a user fee shall be deemed disapproved unless the Governor and General Assembly approve.
 - Void the PennDOT Pathways Major Bridge P3 Initiative and require reconsideration by the P3 Board following the new process outlined in the legislation.

If given 2nd consideration on Monday, the bill will then be sent to the House Appropriations Committee for a fiscal note (all bills must go through House Appropriations for a fiscal note). The House Appropriations Committee could consider SB 382 as early as Tuesday, November 16th but we never really know until the morning of when they announce their agenda.

Next, the bill would need to be favorably reported from House Appropriations back to the full House for 3rd consideration and final passage. Again, House Leadership schedules those final votes so that could happen on any session day (or never) once the bill gets placed on the House voting calendar.

Assuming the House amends the bill, as expected, then the bill would need to return to the Senate for a vote to concur in amendments adopted by the House. However, the Senate doesn’t return to session until December 13th.

Therefore, if everything goes without a hitch, the bill could be sent to the Governor for consideration by **December 13**.
